MEETING OF THE COLLEGE BOARD

The inaugural meeting of the 1985/86 Vancouver Community College Board was held on Wednesday, 1985 February 20 at 16:30 hours.

1. President's Report to the Board. President A.S. Manera indicated that this report - his 87th to the College Board - would be his last. He noted that it was precisely seven years (Feb. 20th) that he assumed his responsibilities as president of Vancouver Community College.

Mr. Manera's report touched on the following items:

- Renewal projects - 13 were identified;

- Dr. Lamoureux's election as secretary of AVA;

- Kiwanis auction;

- Langara students resources building;

- Upgrading the west coast metal fabrication industry;

- Dental technician joint project with UBC dental students;

- Japan Foundation;

- Summer bursary program;

- Public address;

- Contract services and

- Temporary funded courses.

A copy of the President's Report is on file in the KEC library.

2. The reports and recommendations of the Board's Administration Committee and Education/Student Services Committee were received and approved. The reports are included with the Board's agenda and a copy has been placed on file for your information in the KEC library. In summary form, the resolutions from the Administration Committee dealt with the following:

- the approval of the 1985/86 Expense Plan;

- authorization to implement the recommended cost reduction/revenue generating strategies;

- authorization to increase tuition fees to effect an overall increase of 5%, such increases to be effective 1985 September 01.

- 4. Mrs. E. Jarvis was elected chairman of the VCC Board for 1985/86. Mrs. P. Glass was elected vice-chairman.
- 5. Board members were appointed to the several College Board committees and, in addition, members were named as liaison trustees to the several campuses, etc. (A list of Board members, and their appointments to committees, liaison roles, etc., will be released by the Bursar at an early date.)


