# LIBRARY FILMS AND FILM BOOKING


The staffing of library clerical tasks is still being hurt by the current economic restraints. The latest victim is the routine inspection of all films as they are returned from use.

The Bookstore will then close March 28th and 29th while we count anything left over from the sale.


Department Heads with funds still in their budgets (yeah, there may be one or two) should keep in mind all sales prices and discounts will apply to products charged on the monthly billing forms.
