



EMERGENCY PROCEDURES FOR FLOOR WARDENS/DEPUTY FLOOR WARDENS

When the fire alarm sounds, you will ensure the orderly evacuation of your area and check that all washrooms, classrooms, and shops are empty. Should an exit be blocked, be prepared to indicate an alternate route to safety. Once your area is safely evacuated, recruit a monitor to report to the Fire Safety Director--directly, if you have exited to Broadway; indirectly to security personnel if you have exited to Glen or Keith; indirectly to the Receiver if you have exited on the north side of the campus. Please report promptly and by area, e.g.:

Humanities Dept. clear; Autobody clear; Level 5 Administration clear.

The Fire Safety Director will record the area reports and will know when the building has been completely evacuated. The all-clear signal consists of a series of short rings of the alarm bell. The building can be entered once the signal is sounded.

In the event of an alarm after the switchboard has closed (5:00 p.m. Monday to Friday) Security will contact the Fire Department (911). The guard will be prepared to meet and assist Fire Department personnel. Floor wardens and/or their deputies will ensure the evacuation of their areas. A report by area will not be required. An officer from the Fire Department will issue the all-clear command. The guard will sound it from 1533.

Please advise of any revisions of personnel assuming Floor Warden/Deputy Floor Warden roles.



She has a B.A. in economics from the University of British Columbia and is very active in community affairs, as a member of the Community Arts Council of Vancouver, as a member of the advisory panel of the City of Vancouver Downtown Development Permit Board, and as a member of the Education Research Institute of British Columbia's board of directors. She succeeds Peter Hebb as chairman.

Pam Glass was elected vice-chairman of the board.

He has a master of education from Bishop's University and a doctor of civil laws (honoris causa) from Sir George Williams University.

Dr. Gellegher succeeds Teny Menera who left VCC February
28 to become vice-president of human resources for the
Conadian Broadcasting Corporation. Langara Principal, Dr.
J.J. Denholm will act as college president in the interim.

Relations between Canada and Malaysia are the focus of a talk Dr. Paul Chan will give at Langara Campus the evening of Wednesday, March 13. The lecture is part of the ongoing series "Canada's Neighbours in Asia," jointly sponsored by the college's Pacific Rim Program and the Canadian International Development Agency. Dr. Chan is a professor of applied economics at the University of Malaya, as well as being an economics advisor to the Malaysian prime minister. Malaysia, with its crude oil and rubber resources, has built a healthy economy by encouraging foreign investment.

The Vocational Instructors' Association, the representative body for teachers at King Edward Campus and Vancouver Vocational Institute, is having an awards night March 15 at Vancouver Vocational Institute. That evening they will present eight \$200 scholarships to students, recognizing, the efforts they have put into their studies. Under an agreement with the federal government and provincial governments, Vancouver Community College will host a group of 22 Francophone Canadian students at a summer English language training program at Langara Campus.

Under the direction of the UBC students the VVI students are designing the framework for partial dentures, first in wax and plastic, then fabricating the metal framework.
