ADAPTING TO ABILITIES - A Handbook of Administrative and Instructional Adaptations for Teaching Adults with Disabilities

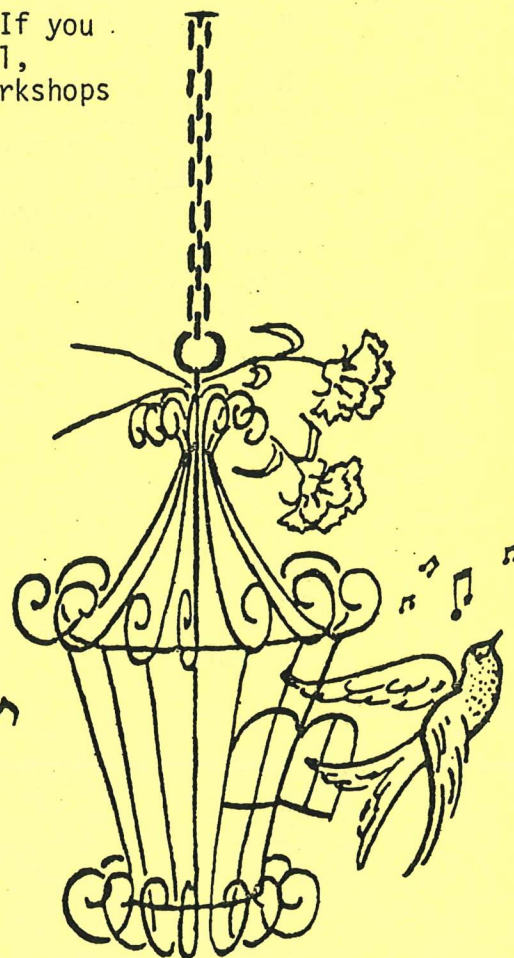

NEWS FROM THE BOOKSTORE

Bookstore Hours - During the next five months (April to August) the Bookstore will experience slightly reduced hours of operation. The basic weekly schedule will be as follows:

Extended hours will take effect as required during the first week of College Foundations classes in May and July. Hours during these periods will be announced in KEC Times and posted at the Bookstore, as soon as they are determined. It is my hope that this schedule will adequately serve all departments. Should any departments require the Bookstore to open on an evening not already scheduled, please contact Greg at the Bookstore. All possible efforts will be made to accommodate your needs.

Used Books - As has been done for the past few terms, a used-book wholesaler will be conducting a used book buy back. The dates this term are April 17th and 18th. The dealer pays cash directly to the student at 50% of the new book prices. In addition, he will take any current edition textbook from any school or term.

This is a great opportunity for students to recover a portion of the substantial amount spent on textbooks. One important point to consider is that many books used this term are not required in the summer term. Therefore, those students wishing to sell such books will not be able to do so privately. Also, the Bookstore depends on this buy-back to obtain our used books. A good response from the students at this time will ensure availability of used books for students enrolling in the May term. It would benefit all parties concerned if instructors would remind their students of this event. Hours for the buy-back will be as follows:

Wednesday, April 17... 10:00 - 4:30
Thursday, April 18... 10:00 - 4:30

Stamps - Our application submitted to Canada Post in May, 1983 to become a stamp-selling agency, has finally been approved. (I think our application went by mail.) This will allow us to rescind the previous limit of 5 stamps per person. No longer will you have to send 3 or 4 of your friends on a stamp buying mission. There will be no limit on the stamps, now available in denominations of 32¢, 37¢ and 64¢. (We even have commemorative stamps!)
