POLICY:

A.1 The Executive Assistant for Administrative and Student Services is responsible for the quality and accuracy of all advertising copy generated by the King Edward Campus and forwarded to the Director of Public Relations for publication.

- A.2 Advertising copy shall be directed to the Executive Assistant for Administrative and Student Services.
- A.3 The Public Relations Department provides financial support for King Edward Campus advertising; however, some advertising expenses may have to be charged against appropriate KEC Expense Plan accounts.

PROCEDURES:

- B.1 All advertising copy will be typed.
- B.2 Division chairmen and/or department heads will prepare advertising copy for instructional programs, which will be initialed and dated to indicate that format and content have been approved.
- B.3 The approved copy will be given to the Executive Assistant for Administrative and Student Services, who will proof-read the copy for accuracy and then duplicate it for his records.
- B.4 The Executive Assistant for Administrative and Student Services will initial and date all copy forwarded to the Director of Public Relations for publication.
- B.5 Except for copy for newspaper advertisements, the Director of Public Relations will return the blue-line proof to the Executive Assistant for Administrative and Student Services for review prior to the publication of King Edward Campus advertising copy.
- B.6 Except for newspaper advertisements, the Executive Assistant for Administrative and Student Services will return the blue-line proof to the originator of the advertisement for review whenever time permits.




