## LETTER RECEIVED FROM MINISTRY OF EDUCATION


Dear Mr. Pankratz:

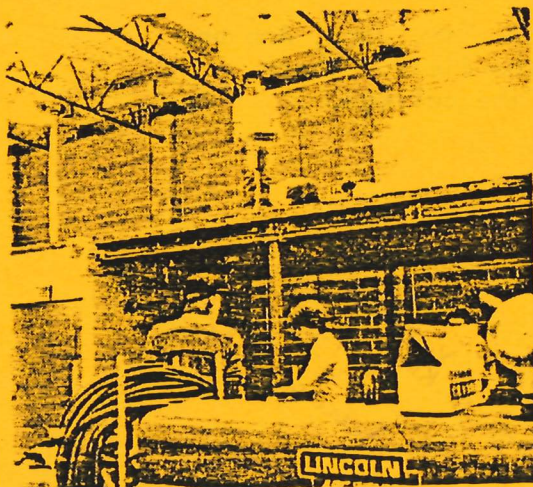
## IF YOU NEED TO KNOW...

VCC's carpentry program recently moved from its old site on the eastside to new quarters on the campus of North Vancouver's Capilano College. The 60 students in the program did extensive renovations to the building they now occupy, giving them valuable "on-the-job" experience. Technical Division Chairman Art Griffiths said Capilano College's administration has been very co-operative and helpful in the transition. "Our new location, just off the Second Narrows Bridge will make for easy access from both the North Shore and eastside," he said.

### 10 STUDENTS TO JAPAN

For a number of years, students from Japan's Takushoku University have come to the college's Langara Campus for a program of English language training. This spring, for the first time, the college's Pacific Rim Program is sending ten students from Canada to Takushoku University. They will be in Japan for one year, living with Japanese families and taking part in an intensive program of language and cultural study.

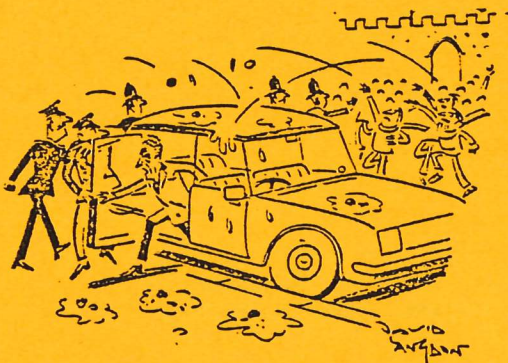
Other Products -
