COLLEGE BOARD MEETING

The regular monthly meeting of the College Board was held yesterday evening (Wednesday, May 22nd) at the Vancouver Vocational Institute campus. New Board members Anthony Saunders and Hope Wotherspoon were welcomed. Board vice-chairman Pamela Glass chaired the meeting.

President Paul Gallagher presented his first report to the Board. His report - a copy of which is on file in the KEC Library - touched on the following:

Board Committee member Barbara Spitz reported for the Education and Student Services Committee. The following had been considered by the committee and

appropriate action was taken by the Board:

- Approval of program objectives for the Nurse Bridging and Instructor Training programs at the Vancouver Vocational Institute;

- Approval of citizenship eligibility policy amendment to include

convention refugees;

- Approval of program reviews: Computer-based Social Services Program and Instructional Computing Program.

Board committee chairman Colleen Miller reported for the Administration Committee and appropriate action was taken by the Board on the following:

- Approval of a new tuition fee schedule showing increases averaging 5% for the period beginning next September. (For some KEC programs, there will be no change and for a few, the off-campus English Language Training programs, a decrease to 75¢ per sch. KEC's new schedule will be posted by the end of this month.)

- Approval of financial report and the audited statements.

President Paul Gallagher presented Vancouver Community College's proposals for accessing the Training for Economic Development Fund of \$5.8 million. He explained that while most submissions received from the several instructional centres were being recommended for submission to the Ministry, only about \$2,000,000 worth - a self-imposed limit by the CEC - are given high priority. Dean Gerry Sylvester chaired a committee, representing the several cost centres, to put the package together. (A copy of the submission is on file in our library.) The Board approved the submission of the proposals to the Ministry, as presented.

Agenda documentation related to the above as well as the Minutes of the meeting of 1985 April 24 have been placed in the KEC Library for the information of those interested.

Among several items dealt with by the Board during its private session preceding the public session, was a report from the College's International Education Committee apprising the Board of discussions taking place with representatives from Korea respecting the possibility of a sizeable contract involving technical training and upgrading, English language training, and instructor training. Discussions are at the preliminary stages only.

RE-CAP ON RE-ORGANIZATION

The re-organization of the KEC instructional programs took effect on April 1st; the major elements of the re-organization being the retention of three divisions, albeit each with a change of name. The three new divisions are:

1. Adult Basic Education Division which includes:

- a) all departments formerly included in the College Foundations Division; (the name "College Foundations Division" will no longer be used); and
- b) the secondary completion, re-entry training (except for the TRAC-Common Core program) and adult special education programs formerly included in the Training and Development Division.


2. Career Division which includes:

- a) TRAC-Common Core, and the specific job-entry training programs formerly included in the Training and Development Division; (the name "Training and Development Division" disappears from our instructional organization); and
- b) the Music Department formerly included in the Communications Arts Division.

3. English Language Training Division which includes:

a) all instructional departments formerly included in the Communication Arts Division except the Music Department; (the name "Communication Arts Division" will no longer be used).
