POLICY:

- A.1 Alcoholic beverages may be consumed during a function at King Edward Campus if permission from the principal or his delegate is granted.
- A.2. All requests to serve alcoholic beverages at campus functions must be made using the approved request form (see attached).

PROCEDURES:

- B.1 The request form, addressed to the Liquor Control Division, Ministry of Consumer and Corporate Affairs, will be completed by the applicant indicating:
- (a) purpose of the licence;
 - (b) approximate number of persons attending;
 - (c) designated area of function;
 - (d) quantities of liquor required;
 - (e) price per drink;
 - (f) time and date of function.
- B.2 The completed request form will be submitted to the Building Services Manager who will forward it to the campus principal, or his delegate for approval.
- B.2 The campus principal or his delegate, may approve the request. A copy will be retained on file and the original will be returned to the applicant for presentation to the addressee.
- B.3 The approved form can be validated at the outlet of the British Columbia Liquor Control Board designated by the Building Services Manager.

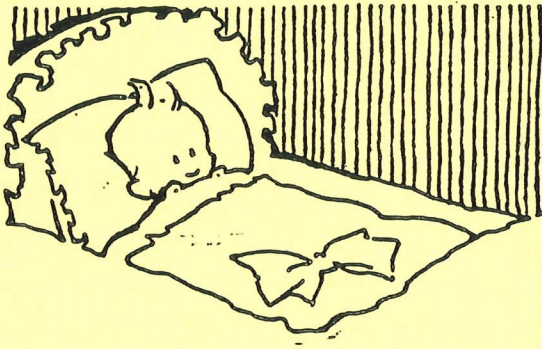

POLICY:

- A.1 All administrators, faculty, staff and students share in the collective responsibility to maintain a clean, comfortable and healthy environment. Positive action in supporting and encouraging colleagues in this regard is part of this responsibility.
- A.1.1 Responsibility for the general tidiness of the campus will be shared by all users of campus facilities.
- A.2 General maintenance and cleaning of the campus is carried out under contract, responsibility for which is vested in the Director of Buildings and Grounds.
- A.3 Smoking and consumption of food and beverages are not permitted in classrooms, washrooms, corridors and stairwells.
- A.3.1 Smoking is permitted in the open plazas, the student lounges on levels two and three and in designated sections of the cafeteria.

PROCEDURES:

- B.1 The Building Services Manager will ensure that a sufficient number of trash receptacles and ashtrays is provided.
- B.2 Faculty and students will ensure that classrooms are left in a clean, tidy condition by:
 - (i) erasing blackboards/whiteboards;
 - (ii) leaving desks, tables, chairs, etc. in an orderly arrangement;
 - (iii) disposing of any garbage (waste paper, etc.) in provided receptacle.
- B.3 Day-to-day problems with respect to maintenance and cleaning are to be referred to the Building Services Manager.

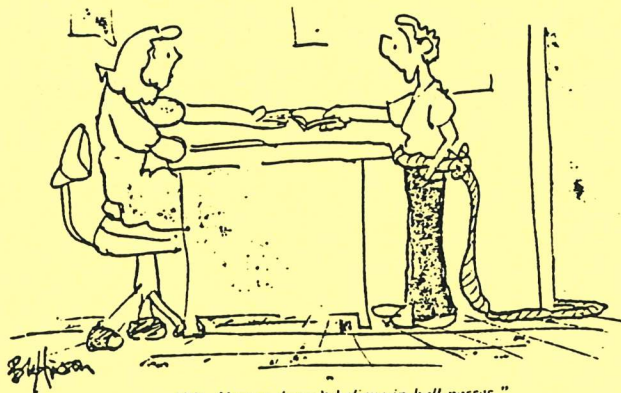
