COLLEGE BOARD MEETING

The monthly meeting of the Vancouver Community College Board was held yesterday evening, Wednesday, 1985 June 26.

College President P. Gallagher's report to the Board was distributed in advance of the meeting, along with the agenda, and consequently, it was not read at the meeting itself. The report touched on about a dozen items, several of which relate directly to KEC: a donation of equipment to the College for the Diesel Mechanics training program; United Way's awards of merit to Myrna Redman, Dave Greenall and King Edward Campus as a whole; the "Soundwave '85" concert tour to Quebec and the choir's successful performance at the Canadian Stage Band Festival. (See letter from Premier Bennett re-printed elsewhere in this issue of the Times.)

The Board approved a number of recommendations from two of its standing committees: the Education and Student Services Committee and the Administration Committee. (The recommendations are included in the documentation attached to the agenda.)

At the request of the Langara Student Society, the Student Society fees were increased by \$3 per student per term.

The Board agreed that the July '85 meeting would be cancelled.

Copies of the minutes of the previous meeting of the Board - held on 1985 May 22 - , the agenda with the supporting documentation, the President's Report and the financial statements for the 1985-86 fiscal year are on file in the KEC Library for the information of those interested.

LETTER FROM W.R. BENNETT - JUNE 18, 1985


Dear Mr. Gallagher:
