





COURSE 1613 FUNDAMENTALS OF WORD PROCESSING

This course from the Instructional Computer Awareness and Applications Program will be offered to college employees on the following Tuesdays at 14:30 in room 402, Vancouver Vocational Institute:

November	19,	26th
December	3,	10, 17th
January	7,	14th

Pre-requisite for this course is the popular course 2500. Introduction to Computer Support Applications, also at VVI. The next scheduled offering of course 2500 is March 1986.

The course will entail 21 hours of supervised instruction and lab-work and approximately 24 hours of practice and self-study for 1.5 credits toward the program (9 credits). Both the Prime computer network and Zenith Personal Computers will be used for the instruction and learning. Software includes MUSE (WordMarc), Multimate and Word Perfect packages.

Register for this useful course at the VVI Admissions department. Fees will be waived when your supervisor approves the time off work. Note that you can take this course even though you may not be interested in working towards a certificate for the program.

I.S.S. HOST PROGRAM FOR REFUGEE SETTLEMENT

The Immigrant Services Society is looking for volunteers to become a part of a host group providing orientation, friendship, guidance and support to newly arrived refugee families, during their period of settlement into Canadian society.

"At the time of the influx of Indo-Chinese refugees, it was found that refugee families which had the support of private sponsors were more quickly and better settled into local Canadian communities. The Host Program is based on the idea that this kind of personal contact can be provided by volunteer host groups with government sponsored refugees. The program, which has already been in successful operation for some time in Eastern Canada, is now being introduced into Vancouver.

We seek no financial assistance from the host groups, but friendship and continuing support to help the newcomers settle in the community and become independent as soon as possible."

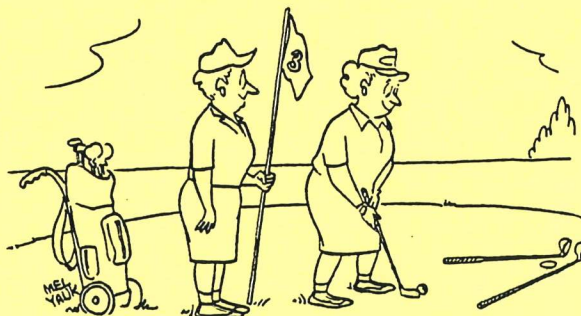

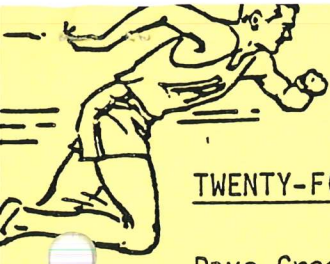
