COLLEGE BOARD MEETING


The November meeting of the VCC Board met Wednesday evening, November 27th.

A copy of the President's Report to the Board has been placed in the KEC Library for the information of those interested. In addition to the printed report, the President reported that the "VCC Training Profile" for 1986/87 - from the Ministry's perspective - is on its way to Vancouver; Mr. Gallagher expects to receive the figures in a day or two. Also, the President reported that this year's United Way campaign at VCC realized a total of \$25,274.72 - more than \$1500 over the goal that had been set in September for this year's campaign. (The full report appears elsewhere in today's issue.)

Reports from the several Board Committees were discussed and appropriate action was taken. The substance of the reports from the Committees is included with the documentation accompanying the agenda, a copy of which has been placed in the Library as well.

Under new business, the Board ratified a number of TFC's and STP's, two of which were TFC's for English Language Training at KEC.


ON BEING GOOD NEIGHBOURS

Included with your copy of the Times, is a Performance Request Form. If you wish to request a performance of some nature, please have all the information ready before you call us - it will cut down the amount of time we spend on the phone handling requests. A few further notes regarding Music Department performances:

- Give us as much lead time as you possibly can. Students sometimes must miss classes and need to make appropriate arrangements in advance. We also need time to find students to perform.
- 2. Don't be upset if we cannot fill your requests all the time. There are times during the school term when our students are very busy and simply can't perform. At this time of year particularly, we are swamped somewhere in the neighbourhood of fifteen to twenty requests per day. We will do our best to accommodate you though.
- 3. Please don't be offended when we ask you if you are planning to pay a fee, an honorarium, or make a donation to the VCC Education Foundation. While our students do not expect to get paid, they would certainly appreciate the fact that their efforts weren't taken for granted. Particularly when performances are off-campus, gas money is greatly appreciated.

In short, our students love to perform, and we will do the best we can in meeting all the needs. So far in 1985 V.C.C. music students have performed over 500 concerts.

Don't forget, you can hear them any and every Wednesday at noon during the school year - in the Auditorium.
