ASSESSMENT CENTRE

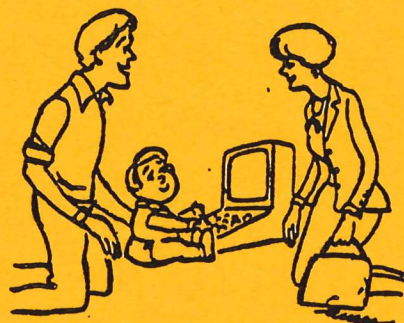
