## 1975 FORD MUSTANG LOTTERY

If all the lottery tickets are sold, we should net approximately \$30,000 for financial aid for students. Because the total College community is involved in buying and selling tickets, the KEC internal campaign committee agreed at its Tuesday meeting that Langara and VVI should each receive a part of the earnings and the amount agreed upon - if all tickets are sold - is \$6,000 to Langara, \$6,000 to VVI and \$18,000 to KEC. (The cost of the restoration, printing tickets, etc. come out of the difference between net and gross.) For each campus - and after the dollar-for-dollar matching - there should be a sizeable increase to its student financial aid endowment fund.

Ticket sales are coming along quite well but there's still a long way to go. Please note that you have until FEBRUARY 14TH to buy/sell the tickets you received from Mr. Gallagher and Mr. Carter. (Don't throw your tickets away; if you can't sell them, please turn them in to Mrs. Girvan.) Also, if you would like more tickets, please see Mrs. Girvan.
