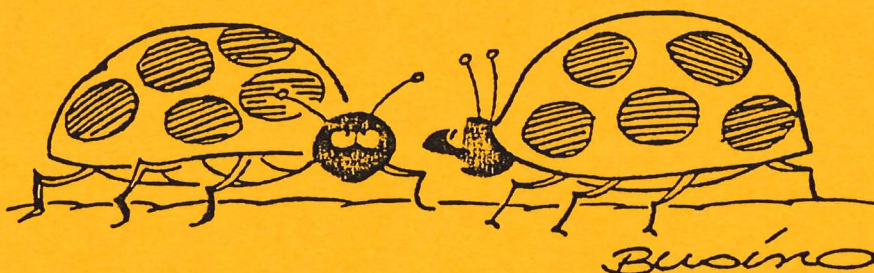

### Security Guard Training Program

(March 3rd - October 10th, 1986)

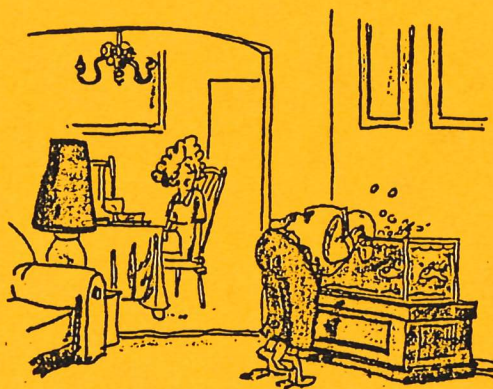
