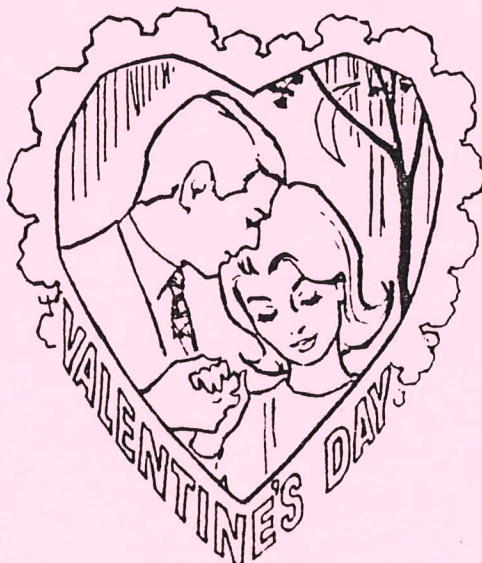

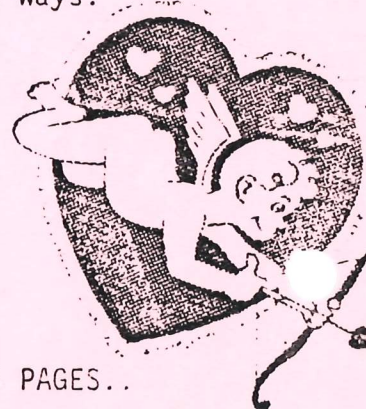

The memorial service will be at Kearney Funeral Services, 1096 West Broadway on Friday, 1986 February 14th at 3:00 p.m.

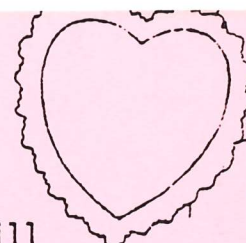

GIFTS TO BE MATCHED BY VANCOUVER FOUNDATION

It is planned that \$100,000 to match with the Vancouver Foundation will be paid over as soon as possible. Funds paid beyond the amount of money now available to the Foundation will be advanced by VCC and repayable by year-end from money raised by the Foundation from all sources including the internal canvass. Thus the incentive of matching may be used until the end of March, 1987.

This will be the last year (at least for the present) in which their gift will be doubled.

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE DIVISION

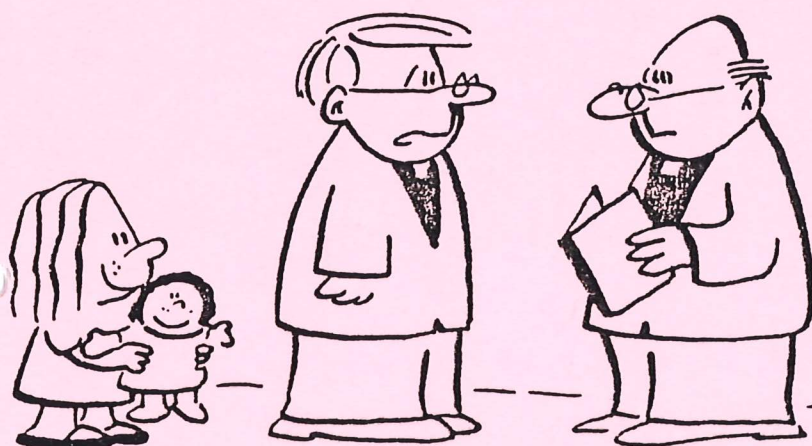
At last Monday's Management Committee meeting, the proposal to change the name of the ELT Division to the ESL Division was presented by Division Chairman M. Bennett.

The change of name has been under review for quite some time and it is felt that changing the name of the division to English as a Second Language Division (or simplified for daily use to ESL Division) will formalize, for VCC, nomenclature used elsewhere in the English-speaking world. Also - but only as an aside - the name change will provide some scope respecting a new name for the ELT-Half-time Department.

The new name will be effective immediately and appropriate modifications will be made in future calendars, program brochures and advertisements - but only as current supplies are exhausted or become out-dated.

Unanimous approval was given to the proposal to adopt English as a Second Language Division as the new name for the ELT Division.
