COLLEGE BOARD MEETING

The VCC Board held its 1986 "inaugural" meeting on Wednesday evening, February 19th and, while the membership of the Board remains unchanged from last year, the Board did elect its officers for the new year. Re-elected as chairman was Mrs. Elizabeth Jarvis and Mrs. Colleen Miller was elected as vice-chairman.

The Board agreed that members would continue to serve in their liaison capacities and on the several committees until the end of the fiscal year.

Following the inaugural meeting, the Board reconvened for its regular monthly meeting.

As a first item of business, the Board received a brief from the peace and disarmament group at Langara Campus. The request was to declare Langara a nuclear weapons-free zone.

A copy of College President Paul Gallagher's report has been placed in the KEC Library for your perusal. In addition to the printed report, Mr. Gallagher also reported that the colleges' institutional evaluations - ours is in progress right now - will satisfy the "sunset clause" as stipulated in the legislation.

In addition to the above, the Board dealt with committee reports and several items of new business, primarily for information.

I have placed a copy of the Board meeting agenda, with documentation and the minutes of the previous meeting, in the Library for those who are interested.


