### MINIMUM DAILY PAY V.M.R.E.U. (This covers Student Aides)

Please be aware that employment of casual staff calls for a minimum paid shift of four hours whether they work one hour or four. (Section 34).

"Section 34 of the Employment Standards Act, Province of British Columbia, prescribes that where an employee is called out to work and commences work, a minimum of four hours' pay must be given. Article XI F of the V.M.R.E.U. collective agreement mirrors this legislation, applying the minimum four hour call-out provision to Student Aides and staff alike. Further, Section X of the Employment Standards Act requires that the employer keep accurate records of the hours worked each day of each employee."
