The VCC College Board met for its regular monthly meeting on Wednesday, April 23rd.

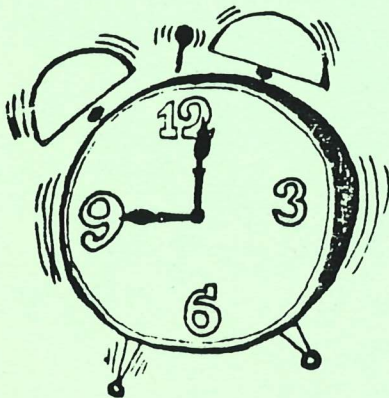
The President's report to the Board covered a variety of items germane to the various instructional centres; a copy has been placed in the Library for your information.

POLICY:

- A.1 Subsequent to the course change period, and up to and including the first instructional day of the last month of the course/program, students may withdraw from that course.
- A.2 A "W" is placed on the transcript for each course from which a student withdraws. Calculation of grade point averages where applicable will exclude such courses.

PROCEDURES:

- B.1 To withdraw, a student will complete a withdrawal form available from the Student Records office.
- B.2 The student will receive his copy of the completed withdrawal form. Other copies will be distributed to the accountant, the counsellor and to the instructor.

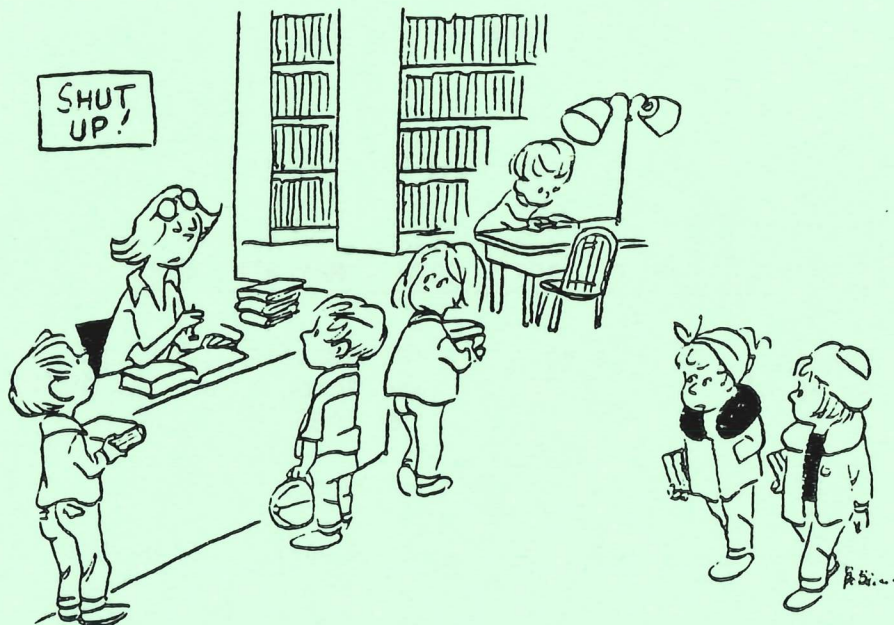


FROM THE CAFETERIA
