FOUNDATIONS:

Total in "Challenge" program Tops \$1,500,000

Endowment funds available to provide student bursaries and meet special equipment and other needs of colleges have increased by more than a million dollars in the past year.

The total on hand, for the 14 colleges participating in the Vancouver Foundation's fund-matching "challenge" program, was reported at \$1,540,000 at the end of 1985.

The plan involves the setting up by the colleges of their own foundations, or similar entities, to raise money in their respective regions and communities and the matching of these amounts by the Vancouver Foundation for a three-year period. Assistance to students will be financed by the interest from the resulting endowment funds. The Foundation's previous assistance to the colleges had been in the form of block grants, generally smaller than the new matching grants.

Further impetus was given the voluntary funding movement by means of a "resource development seminar" held in Vancouver last October, aimed at those involved from the various institutions.

The Vancouver Foundation instituted the new approach after the termination in 1984 of the provincial student grant program.

Some colleges already had foundations in operation. Others promptly initiated them. They take different structural forms and use a variety of fund-raising approaches.

Typical statements from foundation reports:

"The Foundation's main emphasis is in the form of financial aid (bursaries) to the students it serves. The Foundation provides the opportunity for individuals, corporations and associations to become involved in post-secondary education through contributions that support college students, programs and services."(CAMOSUN)

"Donated monies will be used to provide financial assistance to students demonstrating ability and need. The Foundation will also assist college programs by acquiring supplementary equipment and instructional aids." (SELKIRK). (Selkirk conducts a card campaign in the Kootenay-Boundary region. Donors receive cards entitling them to discounts at numerous participating businesses.)

"While the objectives of the Foundation cover a broad spectrum of support for Vancouver Community College, the needs in the area of student aid are so pressing that this became the major focus of our fund-raising in 1985." (VCC Educational Foundation, founded in 1983).
