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## REPORT ON THE MEETING OF THE COLLEGE BOARD

The College Board met for its regular monthly meeting on Wednesday evening, 1986 June 25.

College President Paul Gallagher presented his monthly report to the College Board; a copy has been placed in the KEC Library for the perusal of those interested.

### Board Reports

1. Board member Dr. John Chapman reported on BCAC activities.
2. The matters covered by the Administration Committee and the Education and Student Services Committee had been covered in considerable detail at the committee meetings. New statements of program objectives or changes to extant statements for the following were approved:

Hairdressing Technician  
Pharmacy Technical Assistant  
Vocational-Technical Instructor Training  
CADD Technology I and II  
Sign Language Communicator

3. The Board received VCC's Excellence in Education proposals (which have already been acted upon by the Minister). A Board member felt that insufficient time was available for the generation, perusal, approval and submission of the proposals.
4. The financial statements for the year ending 1986 March 31 were approved.
5. Several trust funds for Langara Campus were approved (p. 24).

Prior to approving the operating budget for VCC for 1986/87 in the amount of \$47,072,900, the Board went into committee-of-the-whole for input from the audience. After brief discussion, the proposed budget was approved. A student representative complimented the Board for not authorizing an increase in tuition fees.

#### New Business

1. The Board requested the administration and the Education and Student Services Committee to proceed with the College's next five-year plan.
2. The Board Chairman announced the capital expenditures grant and the Excellence in Education grant (as reported elsewhere in today's Times).
3. The government-proposed Open Learning Authority was discussed briefly. The legislation, however, was not passed prior to adjournment of the Legislative Assembly.
4. Dr. Gallagher reported on VCC-BCIT cooperative initiatives (pp. 46-48).
5. Dr. Gallagher reported on JOB TRAC (pp. 49-69).
6. A TFC for ESL, already submitted to the Ministry, was ratified.

In private session, the Board approved the awarding of the cleaning contract to Focus Building Services for a period of two years, effective 1986 August 01. (Associated Building Maintenance has held the cleaning contract for the past several years.)

Minutes of the previous meeting as well as agenda documentation have been placed in the KEC Library.

One word of caution, when dialing the cellular telephone there is a 30 second delay before you receive a response - DO NOT HANG UP.

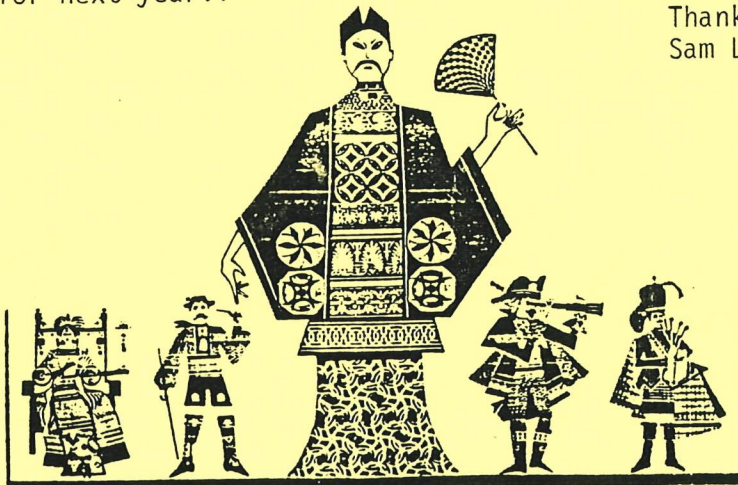

EXTRA DESIGNATED FUNDS FOR VCC

At a meeting on Wednesday afternoon, June 18th, Minister of Post-Secondary Education Russ Fraser announced to board chairmen and presidents the release of additional funds from the Excellence in Education fund; for VCC, the additional grant amounts to \$892,300 of which \$307,300 is designated for capital expenses \$60,000 for tourism/hospitality program at VVI, \$240 for small business training and \$285,000 for KEC's innovative project "From Tax User to Tax Payer." Of the dozen-plus project proposals submitted by the College, I am very pleased with Government's choice of projects to be funded.

The grant for From Tax User to Tax Payer will put an increased work load on our financial aid operation and again, I'm pleased that the \$285,000 grant includes provision for an additional staff member for the Financial Aid Office. Evelyn Buriak, our Financial Aid Officer will be alerting MHR offices that tuition support is now available for their clients if they require further education/training in order to be better equipped for employment.

Mrs. Shirley Girvan, our Manager of Financial and Ancillary Services suggested the From Tax User to Tax Payer proposal earlier this spring when the Excellence in Education Fund was announced. On Thursday morning when I complimented her on her good idea, she responded, with a wry grin, "Well, watching the news late at night does pay off sometimes." Obviously, there had been a brief news item on television on San Diego's requirement that social assistance recipient's attend school while receiving assistance. San Diego reported a significant reduction in the number of unemployed in that country. Thanks, Shirley; I'll look forward to receiving more good ideas.
