#### ROBERT CUNNINGHAM

KEC's Dean of Instruction Robert Cunningham announced at Monday's meeting of the Management Committee his intention to take early retirement this fiscal year, effective 1987 March 31.

Mr. Cunningham has served Vancouver Community College in a variety of positions since 1965 August 01 - 21 years ago tomorrow - when the College was founded (under its earlier name of Vancouver City College). Initially appointed as an instructor of mathematics, he soon moved over to counselling but, in the late 1960s moved into an administrative position with special responsibility for evening programs and courses. After the opening of the Langara Campus in October 1970 and the subsequent re-opening of the old King Edward Campus at West 12th Avenue and Oak Street in August 1971, Robert took on responsibility for instructional programs to be offered at the re-opened site. Enrolment literally leap-frogged during the first two years, rising from 200 in 1971 to over 2000 at the end of the second year. The campus continued to grow in size, although not as rapidly, reaching an all-time high of over 7200 in the January to April term of 1983. (Today our enrolment is back down to 5000-plus during fall, winter and spring terms.) During the fifteen years since 1971, Robert's input has been very evident as new programs have been added; different program options have been tried; curricula have been written and re-written; our organization has been changed to meet new needs, and then changed again to meet other needs, etc.

I know Dean Cunningham has enjoyed his work at the College. He told me recently that he felt it was time for him to leave and on Monday he decided to make it official. Thanks, Robert, from all of us.

# HEALTH SERVICES VACATION




