STUDENT ADVOCATE PROGRAM

As I'm sure you are aware, a disproportionate number of KEC students are "special needs" students. Some examples of the problems they deal with are loneliness, pressures of single parenthood, unemployment, physical/learning disabilities or cultural/language problems. Given present counselling staffing, we are limited in our ability to offer supportive services to these students. In some educational settings the establishment of a peer program has extended these services.

Starting in January, we will attempt to institute a student advocate program at KEC. The program will involve intensive training in communication, problem solving, and advocacy skills as well as an awareness of the "special needs" of our students and community resources.

Examples of how student advocates would help:

- a student advocate who is an advanced ESL student is paired with a beginner to help the new student get oriented to school, government bureaucracies, etc.
- a student advocate could accompany a physically disabled student to a community resource to get adaptive equipment for school.
- a student advocate who has been successful in school could be paired with a new mature student who is fearful about returning to school.

TRAINING

8 weeks, 4 hours per week starting week of Jan. 16. At the beginning there will be a 2-day intensive workshop.

REFERRALS

Instructors are encouraged to refer students who:

1. seem mature, emotionally stable and responsible.
2. are probably going to be enrolled at KEC over the next year or are willing to make a commitment to work with KEC students over the next year.

Note: This program would be appropriate for those interested in the helping professions as they will get valuable pre-employment training and experience.


