COLLEGE BOARD MEETING

The regular monthly meeting of the College Board was held on Wednesday, 1986 Nov. 26.

1. Board member John Pearkes reported briefly on behalf of the VCC Educational Endowment Fund Board.
2. Board chairman Elizabeth Jarvis reported on two meetings board chairmen and board chairmen with college presidents had with the new minister.
3. Board member Colleen Miller, chairman of the Administration Committee reported for the committee. The recommendations resulting from the committee meeting are covered on pages 16 to 18 of the agenda. The committee's recommendations were approved as submitted. In addition, the seven-month fiscal statement ending October 31st was received.
4. College president Paul Gallagher reported to the Board respecting VCC's request for matching funds for equipment.
5. Mr. Gallagher reported that the External Team Report on VCC's Institutional Evaluation has now been received and copies have been given to Board members. He recommended that the Board authorize wider circulation of the report.
6. Board member John Chapman spoke to the draft proposal for affiliation with the Native Education Centre (as presented at a previous meeting of the Board) along with a covering memorandum from Mr. Gallagher. The motion to submit the proposal to the Ministry, with a minor amendment, was approved.
7. Langara Campus principal J.J. Denholm brought the Board up to date respecting the renovations being planned for the facilities at Langara.
8. VVI principal H.W. Rerup apprised the Board respecting a special training project (VCC #306) proposal recommended for funding for the Printing Production program. The proposal was approved.
9. A proposed schedule of Board meetings for 1987 was distributed.
10. A meeting for December has not yet been scheduled.

I have placed a copy of the agenda plus background documentation, the minutes of the meeting of the October 29th meeting and a copy of the Centre Reports in the KEC Library for the information of those interested.

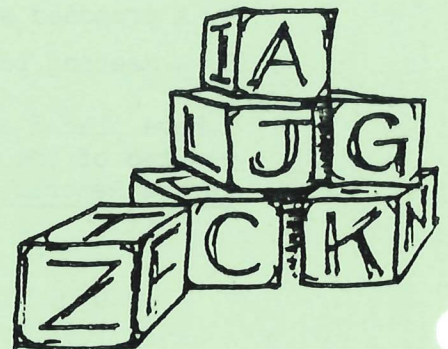

THE FOLLOWING TWO ITEMS HAVE BEEN TAKEN FROM THE CENTRE REPORTS

FINNING CONTRACT

Finning Tractor and Equipment Company has contracted with KEC to provide instructional training for some of their apprentices. Several modules - each module requiring 80 hours of instruction - emanating from this type of interaction between the campus and industry is seen as a positive move.

The first of the modules was offered a few weeks ago and the course evaluations submitted by the apprentices were all very positive.

COMMUNITY LIAISON TEAM

The KEC Community Liaison Team has not yet been in existence for a year but already the team has been instrumental in creating a new image of Vancouver Community College in the community, having linked the College to ethnic groups requiring business assistance, community groups needing marketing support, and creating a growing interest in community economic development. This latter interest has resulted in the College being a partner with the City of Vancouver Planning Department, the Neighbourhood Association and Neighbourhood House which also involves the supervision of UBC Social Work graduate student Leslie Kemp in her thesis research on Community Economic Development Mount Pleasant.

A working partnership between King Edward Campus and the Mount Pleasant Business Association has also been established. The College joined the Association less than a year ago. Now the College's Small Business representative, Howard Turpin, is a member and secretary of the Board of Directors of the Mount Pleasant Business Association. This group is presently undertaking a Downtown Revitalization project on Main Street at Broadway. Thus the College is in a unique position to provide a range of services to the local business community. For example, the Langara Campus Marketing program, through Keith Murray, has already become involved in a community workshop and training activities based on the Thunder Bay model which calls for learning to take place in the work place with college resources being deployed in the community.

Community Liaison has also generated a renewed interest in the possibility of a community recreational facility on the King Edward Campus. The increasingly high population concentration in the KEC area of Mount Pleasant has resulted in the suggestion in the most recent City of Vancouver Planning Department report on Mount Pleasant that King Edward Campus be one of the suggested sites for a satellite community centre - a mini-Britannia Centre.
