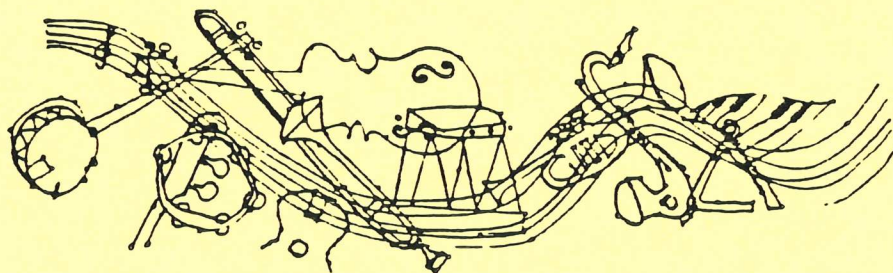

Notes from the College Board Meeting

The College Board met for its regular monthly meeting on Wednesday, 1987 January 28. What follows is a summary of decisions taken:

1. The report of the Administration Committee, chaired by Colleen Miller, was received. Several recommendations of the committee concerning emergency repairs at VVI, several new scholarships and the nine-month financial report were approved.
2. The report of the Institutional Evaluation Committee, chaired by John Chapman, was received. The action plan for beginning the implementation of recommendations was approved.
3. The report of the Education and Student Services Committee, chaired by John Chapman, was received. A variety of recommendations about new programs, program changes, student assistance and renovations at Langara were approved.
4. The president reviewed the Program Profile for 1987-88.
5. Two TFC's for training Electronic Technicians were approved to be forwarded to the Ministry.

In the Private Session:

1. The board received a report on our proposal for improving opportunities for staff development.
2. The board approved the Administration Committee's recommendation to purchase a new mainframe computer for the College and to purchase new press equipment for VVI. The latter item was funded by a Special Training Program grant.
3. The president's revised College Vision Statement was approved for distribution.
4. The president reported briefly on the VCC Educational Foundation, noting that it was moving slowly towards being self-funded.
5. The contract to repair a major retaining wall at VVI was approved.
6. Richard Pearce reported to the Board on progress made in planning courses to be offered with and at the Board of Trade.
7. J.J. Denholm reported on the status of the alternate student newspaper, The Gleaner.
8. The president announced that the formal agreement for cooperation with BCIT would be signed in March.
