
How are we going to raise money when we're washing cars for free, you ask?

GIVE PEACE A DANCE

"Give Peace a Dance" is a 12 hour dance marathon to be held on Saturday, May 30, 1987 in Vancouver. Similar events have been very successful in raising funds in a number of American cities. Last year the event raised \$130,000 in San Francisco and in 1984, it raised \$71,000 in Seattle.

This first "Give Peace a Dance" in Vancouver is produced by the Pacific Peace Umbrella Society. It is officially endorsed by Vancouver City Council as well as Vancouver and District Labour Council. The End the Arms Race Coalition is officially supporting the event and is encouraging its member organizations to actively participate.

AT THE LIBRARY


