DAY-TIME COURSES, INSTRUCTOR'S DIPLOMA PROGRAM


Recently she has become well known throughout the B.C. college system for her work with the highly acclaimed Pacific Management Development Institute.

GETTING HELP FOR ILL STUDENTS

Yesterday (Wednesday) a student was sent to the VVI campus by a KEC staff member who knew that the doctor is usually there on Wednesdays. As it turned out the doctor is away on vacation until July 27 and the student had a wasted trip and then had to go to the doctor at Langara. That is a lot of travelling if you are not feeling well.

It would be better if staff would not send ill students off the campus or try to make decisions about the care of students. If a student is ill or is asking to see a doctor the first step should be to contact the Student Health Service (local 209). The nurse will do an assessment and primary intervention if appropriate, or she may send the student to an appropriate health care provider. This is the quickest and most efficient way to get help for your students.

If the nurse is unavailable a First Aid Attendant can be called by dialling local 230.

During August, when the nurse is away on vacation, dial the counselling receptionist and ask when the doctor will be in (he will be here for part of most days); or call for a First Aid Attendant.

BUT DON'T FORGET THAT IF IT IS AN EMERGENCY you should immediately dial local 777 and give your location and a brief description of the problem - help will be sent immediately.


During my holidays (1987 July 20 to 1987 August 07) Shirley Girvan will look after my desk in regards to routine matters; others should be referred to the office of the Principal.
