## IN MEMORIAM OF PAUL COOK:

Paul Cook died last week. He had been seriously ill for more than a year but it was not the respiratory difficulties that caused his death but rather heart failure. So his death came as a shock.

Paul came to the College in 1979 to head up the K.E.C. Library. If I remember accurately Kathy Bigsby, Allen Andrews and I sat on the interview committee which first met this experienced English librarian who came to Vancouver by way of a library in Cornerbrook, Newfoundland. He rolled up his sleeves and addressed the task of providing library service from cramped, awkward quarters in the basement of the old King Edward gym and coping with students in outreach centres all over the City.

He built up the library collection, added staff and extended service when funds were available; he contended with budget cuts and staff lay-offs with as much equanimity as possible. He was always a professional.

Like many of us, Paul was a two-family person. He and his wife, Pat, both brought children to their marriage. I saw the love and care that he extended to all his "children." I can guess how deeply his death will be felt by his family.

I know that his colleagues and friends within the VCC library will miss him and that many of the staff of the KEC library who worked with him from the day he arrived will feel a great loss ... as will his friends throughout the Campus. I know I miss him and feel sad at his early death.
