

United Way kicked off its 1987 campaign on Wednesday, September 23, 1987 with a luncheon at the Trade and Convention Centre.





# Chairman of the College Board Honoured

The September 9 issue of <u>The Vancouver Courier</u> carried an article describing awards presented by the <u>Junior League</u> of Vancouver. Among the recipients of awards for outstanding contribution as a volunteer in the community was Mrs. Elizabeth Jarvis, Chairman of our College Board. Among other things the article notes that:

"Mrs. Jarvis came to Canada from Vienna as a child. She attended York House School and UBC where she earned her Bachelor of Arts Degree with an Economics Major. She also attended the Sorbonne in Paris.

Mrs. Jarvis began her work in voluntarism when she joined the Junior League of Vancouver in 1958 and she has continued her involvement in the community for almost thirty years.

She has been a docent for the Vancouver Aquarium and the Vancouver Museum. She has served with distinction on the Boards of the Museums and the Planetarium Association, the Education Research Institute of B.C., the Community Arts Council and the Advisory Panel to the Downtown Development Permit Board. She is also a founding member of the Vancouver Community College Education foundation.

One of Mrs. Jarvis' more significant contributions to the community is the work she has been doing on the Vancouver Community College Board. She has been with the Board since 1978 and has been the Chairman of that Board since 1985. Presently, the Board is very proud of its latest project: a \$4 million expansion of the Langara Campus Library and other student service areas. Construction began this summer."
