Dorothy Neville took early retirement in May 1987. After recovering from a serious riding injury she decided to change from her one half-time position to full time retirement.

Dorothy was the first Counsellor working at the Special Programs Division (now KEC) of Vancouver City College (now Vancouver Community College).

Before moving to VCC, Dorothy worked for the Federal Department of Indian Affairs as the Special Counsellor for native B.C. Indians. In 1970 she was hired by VCC through a contract with the Federal Government. In April 1976, the Special Services for Native Indians was discontinued, and Dorothy joined the KEC Counselling Department.

Dorothy knew all the Native Indian Band Leaders, and had contacts throughout B.C., which she made during her extensive B.C. travels. Her office walls were covered with pictures of native families, from babies to grandparents. She was recognized for offering competent and humanistic services. Native students still sought her out after she moved to the Counselling Department. Dorothy is well known for her knowledge, wisdom, humour, independent spirit, and her unique sense of style. Staff, faculty and students will experience her loss from the College.


