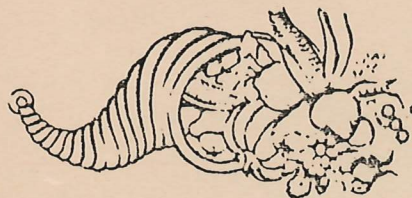

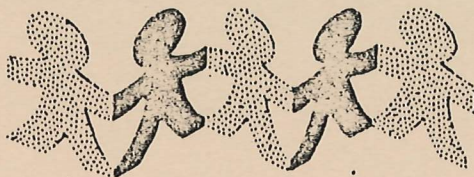
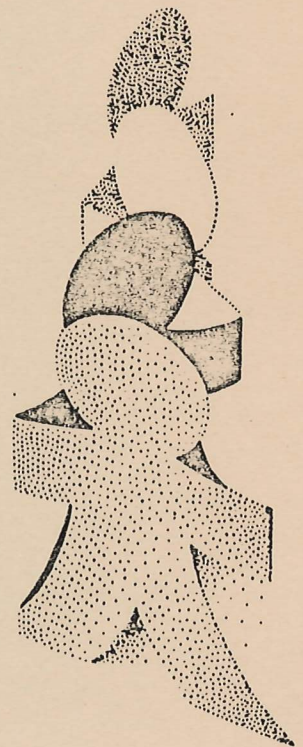

Activities include:

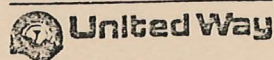
- * displays by United Way agencies


RE: MAIL STRIKE

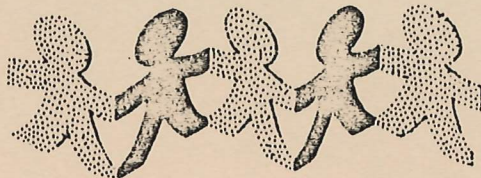

KEC HAS A NEW AND DIFFERENT PROGRAM - SPIRIT SONG THEATRE ARTS:

King Edward Campus has taken on a new and different program — Spirit Song Theatre Arts. To quote from their brochure:

Out of the shadows of our past steps a unique style of dramatic Indian expression.

"The skillful Indian Storyteller" was both actor and master of narrative.

"The Drum" sends the music spiraling upwards to mingle among the night stars.

"The Dancers" place their soft moccasin steps in the circle as they always have.

The natural elements of drama were interwoven into this fabric of the first peoples' social and cultural society.

From these powerful theatrical roots, Spirit Song, through its Theatre Arts Program, is recalling those aboriginal dramatic talents and blending them with standard theatre practice.

This program will be run by Lynn Phelan and David Secunda, and other talented resource people and it will last from October 13, 1987 until June 30, 1988. Unfortunately for us, it will be off campus, but by next year I hope we will see some productions in our auditorium.

HAPPY NOTES FROM TED AND SHANNON HOUGHAM:

Ted and Shannon are, as many of you know, on leave for seven months to work in LAC LA MARTRE Northwest Territories. Following are excerpts from Shannon's recent letter:

"Our house is actually quite nice. From the outside it looks like an old dumpy log cabin but inside its quite modern. We do have running water, hot and cold, (and can you believe this) flush toilet — it's a larger version of what would be in a boat. We also have an electric stove and a real house furnace.

And now for the really big news! I have been offered an Adult Education position here in Lac La Martre. Its a full time position starting in a week or two and ending the same time as Ted's. I will be setting up the course, English, math, science, social studies and job readiness skills. My students will spend 2 hours a day in practicums around town. All the experience I gained in the different classes I interpreted in and my I.D. program skills will really be put to the test.

The town is quite beautiful. A lot of civic pride. Houses kept in good shape and yards trim and decorated. The elementary school is 3 years old and absolutely beautiful. Better than most in Vancouver. Both Ted and I will have our classes in the school.

We get water delivered every day and the post office is open every day, regular hours. The store is owned by the town its co-op and seems to be managed well, however I do notice a distinct lack of fresh green things.

I guess Ted should be home soon, so I'll say goodbye for now. The whole town will say goodbye on Thursday as they all head to Fort Simpson for the Pope Show.

Facilitators of Instructional Skills Workshops at Red Deer College are preparing to publish a first newsletter to promote and support Instructional Skills Development. Ed Kamps, Faculty Development Animateur at Red Deer College, wrote to invite participation. Some relevant details are excerpted from his letter:

The Instructional Skills Program continues to evolve and expand to new centres, bringing in new people and their ideas. The concept of a newsletter to facilitate networking among the various ISW facilitators/contact people was supported at the June '87 "Potlatch" professional development retreat. What is proposed is a 2-4 page newsletter sent out 2-3 times a year to facilitators and contact people in the ISW Program. The purposes of the newsletter include:

- to nourish a healthy, viable ISW network.
- to provide a vehicle for the exchange of information and ideas.
- to shape the continuing evolution of the ISW program.

Contents of the newsletter would involve:

- instructional design ideas.
- resources/bibliographies.
- information regarding other relevant organizations or approaches.
- thought pieces.

The facilitators at Red Deer College are volunteering to organize and publish the newsletter for the 1987-88 year, with the deadline for submission for the first issue being October 20.
