## SUPERANNUATION COMMISSION FIELD TRIPS TO THE LOWER MAINLAND:

Representatives from the Superannuation Commission travel to the Lower Mainland once every month, except August, to meet employees and employers covered under the various pension plans that the Commission administers. These trips usually take place on either the first or second Thursday and Friday of each month. The interviews are scheduled to be held at the Court House in New Westminster Thursday afternoon and Medical Services Plan office in downtown Vancouver Friday mornings.

The main objective of these visits is to provide personal counselling to employees who are contemplating retirement within the NEXT YEAR OR TWO. However, the Superannuation Commission is also prepared to schedule interviews with employer representatives to discuss various features of the pension plans and the commission policies and procedures.

If an employee is contemplating retirement and only requires an estimate of his/her pension, please have them write or telephone this office.

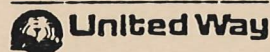

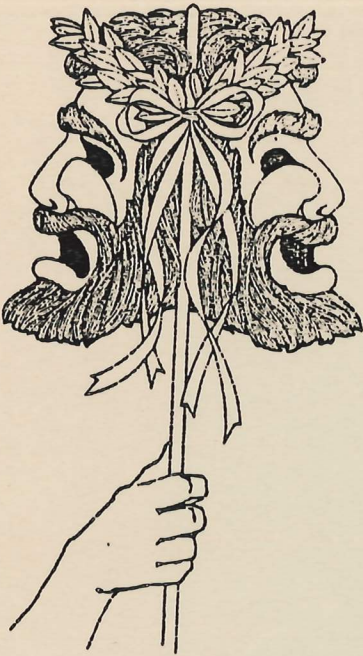

Last year's event was a great success. This year promises to be another enjoyable evening.

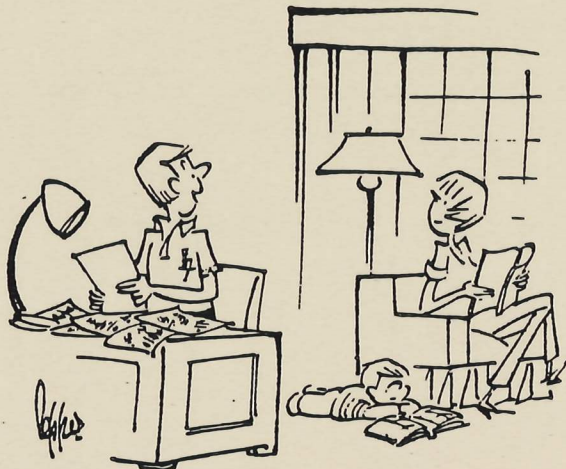
