The clinic held on September 28, 1987 was attended by 92 donors, of which 69 were able to donate. It was less than we had hoped for but I feel we have a good base to build on.

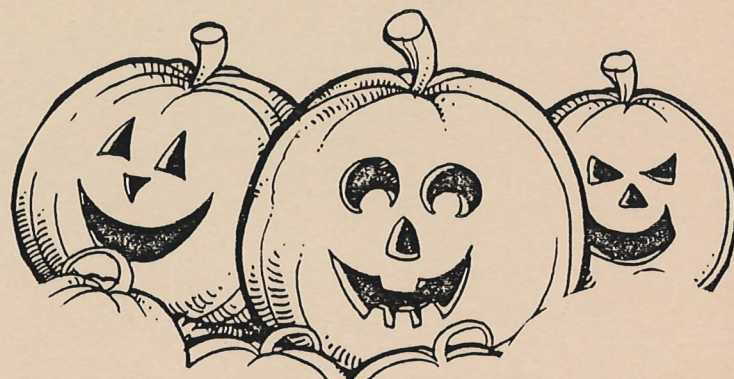

AT THE LIBRARY:

We have been experiencing some difficulties with unattended children in the library. We will attempt to deal with the problem with the following measures:

1. Only children who have a parent on campus will be permitted to stay in the library.
2. If a child is left unattended in the library, we will request the parent to leave us some emergency information such as a room number where they can be reached.
3. Children who do not have a parent on campus will be asked to leave. They will be given a letter to take home which explains how an adult may obtain a Community Borrower card, and inviting parents to visit their nearest public library.

Library staff request that any VCC instructors or staff who are aware of a student who is bringing their children onto campus and leaving them unattended, advise them of library policy.

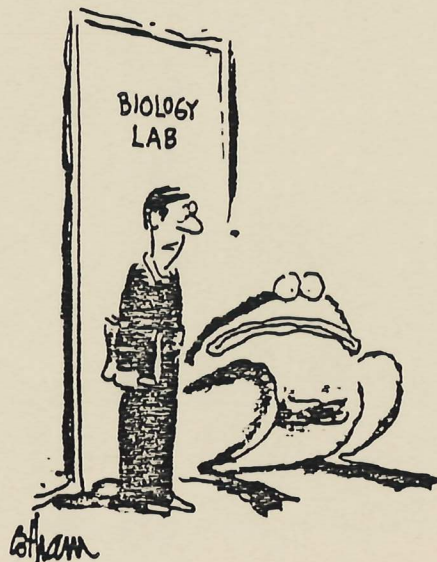
POSITION OPENINGS:
