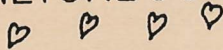
THANK YOU

V.C.C. WOMEN'S NETWORK UPDATE:

Thirty-eight employees attended the first V.C.C. Women's Network gathering at V.V.I. on December 9, 1987. In general there was agreement that the group's activities should help all women in the College to realize their potential. In smaller groups each woman discussed her expectations of the Network, the direction the Network should take; and specific ideas for Network activities.

Responses varied from wanting to accomplish specific objectives such as promoting day care and establishing a sexual harassment policy, to concern for female employee's movement within the organization, to supporting women students.

There was unanimous agreement that we should continue in a flexible way, encouraging people to attend when possible and when interested in a particular program or issue. We will vary the programs, the organizing group, the campus and the day of the gathering. Generally we will work towards open informal meetings which have an optional social component and an element of information sharing. Watch for the next Network program in this newsletter. 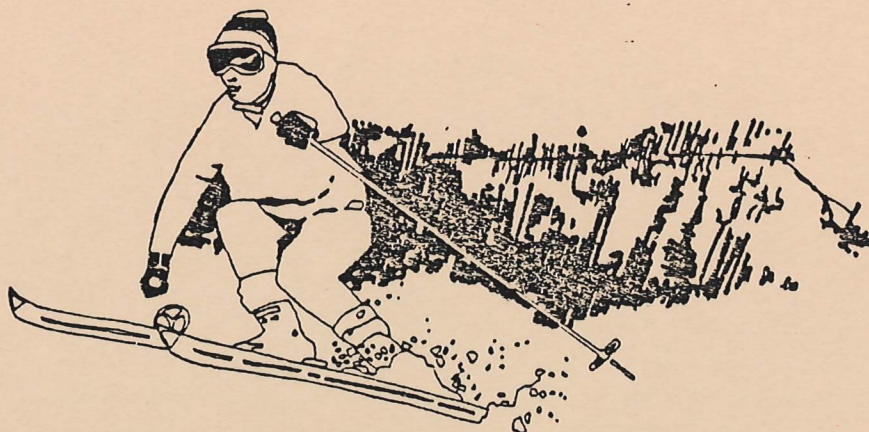

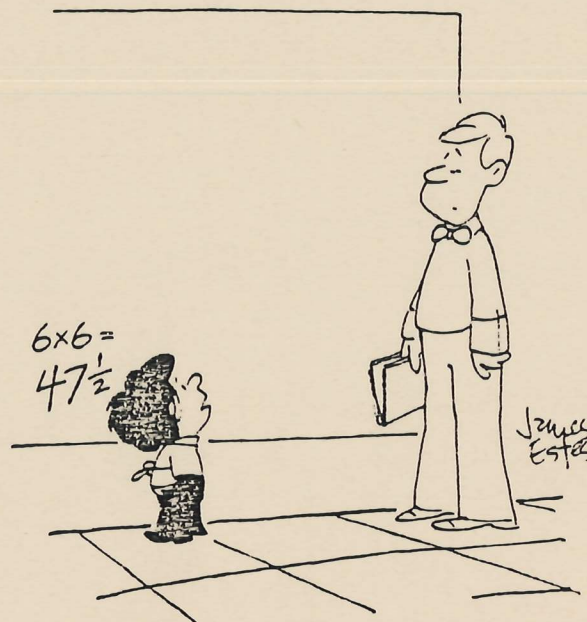

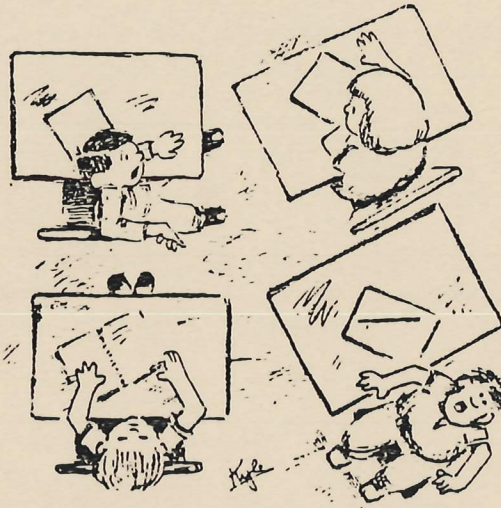
V.C.C./K.E.C. requires a Clerk II - Admissions. Closing date for applications is January 28, 1988.
