I would like to encourage everyone in participating in the Lottery and I hope the V.C.C. Foundation has a most successful campaign in enrolling the participants they need.

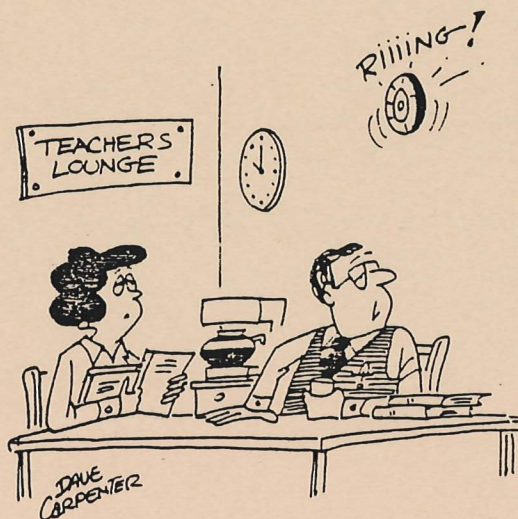
