

WALKS IN THE NEIGHBOURHOOD

For those people who still work in the old measuring system:
1 mile = 1609 meters.

Walk One

- start on level 3 in the south east corner stairs and walk down to level one. Then west along the corridors to the stairs at the elevator lobby. Up to Level 1.5 (R) and north along the corridor to the stairs. Up one level to level 2 and into the staff cafeteria.
TOTAL - 210 meters

Walk Two

- start at the top of the main stairs on level 4, walk down the stairs to level 1 and head east to Keith Drive. Walk north on Keith to 7th, walk west on 7th to Glen, and walk south on Glen to Broadway. Then walk along Broadway to the main entrance and over to the top of the stairs.
TOTAL - 620 meters

Walk Three

- Start anywhere at the lower parking lot and walk completely around the property.
TOTAL - 402 meters

(1 point) Walk Four - Walk around the track at China Creek.

(1 point) Walk Five - Instead of using a transit transfer at Broadway and Commercial Skytrain walk the 4 1/2 - 5 blocks each way (10 minutes walking).

(2 point) Walk Six - Drive to Trout Lake, park at the community centre walk around the lake approximately 3/4 mile. (12, 13, & 14 and Victoria) or walk 8 blocks.

(2 point) Walk Seven - Walk to the Mount Pleasant Library, 370 East Broadway (in the Kingsgate Mall). 10 blocks each way.

GET THE FACTS ON FAX:

Next time you need a "hot" delivery by messenger, check to see if the recipient has a FAX machine instead. This terrific new service can help you communicate quickly and economically with other campuses, as well as other FAX subscribers nationally and internationally.

FAX, which stands for Facsimilie Service, is a technology which enables the user to transmit a documents (literally any document of any length) from one FAX machine to another via standard telephone networks.

It's rates are more than competitive when compared with alternative services. For example, compare the rates to send a four-page document from Vancouver to Toronto:

Telex	\$38.44	Priority Post:	\$15.80
Courier	\$19.79	FAX	\$ 1.10

The FAX machine is located in the IMS office opposite the Bookstore and is operated by the IMS staff. If you're not sure whether a particular company has a FAX, check the North American and International FAX directories available in the KEC Library.


