STUDENT CENSUS:

You may remember that twice before, in February, 1978 and February, 1983, we ran a comprehensive student "census". It is that time again! In all, we hope to survey 21,000 V.C.C. students. From this census and its predecessors we will get a good profile of our students over ten years. To do so requires an imposition upon you and your students.

On the morning of Monday 1988 March O7 (next Monday) most instructors will find in their mail boxes a bundle of 40 census forms, together with an instruction sheet. In summary, you will be asked:

PLEASE:

- Administer the census to the <u>first</u> class you meet on Monday, 1988 March 07.
- ...but only to those students who did <u>not</u> complete the census in an earlier class.
- In each class subsequent to your first on Monday, through and including Tuesday evening, have the census form completed by the students who have not yet done so.
- An additional supply of forms will be available in the mail room.
- Return completed forms to a box which will be in the mail room.
- Return unused surplus forms to the "additional supply" table in the mail room.

COUNSELLING DEPARTMENT

KEY PROCEDURES

- l. An appointment is normally required for an interview with a counsellor. Appointments are made by the receptionist. When time permits, individuals are seen on a "drop-in" basis (local 208).
- 2. Counselling emergencies/crises: contact the counselling front desk receptionist for quick access to a counsellor (local 208).
- 3. When referring a student to counselling, please either call the receptionist, or send a referral slip with the student. (Unless previously arranged, the receptionist will assign the student to a counsellor.)
- 4. Counsellors and Health Services personnel can make referrals to the campus psychiatrists and psychologist.
- 5. Enrolled International Education students make appointments with counsellors through the receptionist.

Appointments with one of the International Education Student Service Assistants (Christine Lee; Catherine Ip), are made by Judy Chan or Florence Tao in the International Education office. (locals 491;233).

- 6. Requests for workshops, information sessions, tours please contact Lorraine Herlick in the Counselling Resource Centre. (local 489).
- 7. For information on programs, careers and community services, contact the Counselling Resource Centre (locals 496,497).
- 8. When referring students to a student advocate, please complete a Student Advocate Referral form or provide the student with a referral note, indicating the purpose of the referral. Student advocates may be contacted by leaving a message with the Counselling receptionist. (24 hour notice is minimum turn-around time.)
