Career-related Course Reimbursement:


Program Description - Provides for reimbursement of tuition fees where V.C.C. employees cannot be accommodated in <u>career</u>-related courses, except by payment of fees.

SOME ASTOUNDING FACTS ABOUT THE KEC LIBRARY:

We are a pretty busy place, and it seems like we are getting busier all the time. Here are some statistics (from last fiscal year) that will give you an idea of what happens here:

Hours:

Open 56 hours each week during September - June Open 49 hours each week during July - August

Collection:

48,754 Catalogued items (including books, films, videos, filmstrips, slides, etc.). Several thousand uncatalogued items (including paperback books, pamphlets and magazines and newspapers).

3,912 Items (excluding microfiche) were added to the KEC collection last year, including books and audio cassettes.

Circulation:

68,916 Items were signed out of the Library last year. Weekly average circulation for 86/87. 1,380

Patrons:

203,553 Visits to the Library were counted last year. 4,071 Weekly average for the year.

Information Services:

15,619 Patrons were assisted by reference staff last year. 2,375 Students participated in Library tours and orientations.

396 Students received bibliographic instruction from Librarians working with faculty on Library based assignments. 2.5 Librarians and 1.0 LA V cover the reference desk at all times with the occasional assistance of other Library staff.

CHINESE FILMS DONATION - M. Epp

Vancouver Community College has been honoured with a gift of 57 Chinese feature films from the classic period of Asian film production during the 1940's and 50's.

The films were donated by Mr. Wai Sum Lai, now living in Ontario. His father, Mr. Quing Ling Lai, acquired the films and their distribution rights when he was a film distributor in Hong Kong. Now residing in Vancouver, Mr. Quing Ying Lai was a student at School Canadiana, a branch of the King Edward Campus' English as a Second Language Division.

The film collection is an invaluable resource for film study, as well as Chinese cultural and literature study. The collection includes comedies, love stories, and adaptations of famous Chinese stories. In addition, there is a series on a popular "king fu" character derived from story books on the martial arts. Some of the films have English sub-titles. Although many of the films are in black and white (16 mm), there are also 10 colour films.

The Library has a number of tasks to complete before the film collection will be ready for use. Each film will be inspected, cleaned, and repaired if necessary. The Library is also investigating the process of making a preservation copy in videotape format, as well as a circulating videotape copy.

Since some of the films are in cinemascope format, these will need to be transferred to videotape for educational use.

The final process includes cataloguing, labelling, and packaging of the films and tapes for use.

When the procedures for preservation and listing are completed, the college will publicize the collection to the community.
