

#### CELEBRATING VANCOUVER COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Come and join your friends and colleagues at VCC Day!
It takes place Monday, April 25 at the BC Enterprise Centre.

VCC Day has been organized for everyone who works at VCC, whether a full-time, part-time, permanent or temporary employee of the College. The purpose of the day is for instructors and staff to meet your counterparts on the other campuses and find out more about what goes on elsewhere in the College. VCC Day has been designed to explore, through speakers and a panel discussion, issues of interest to the entire College. The theme for the day: <a href="Education, Passion">Education, Passion</a>, and the Real World.

The idea for VCC Day originated with, and has been put together by a volunteer committee made up of Continuing Education Senior Program Coordinator, Jill Tyndale (chair), Dalton Kremer and Sandra Jones from VVI, Martin Gerson and Bob Worcester from Langara, Sam Lewindon and Terry Smith from KEC, Paul Sinnott from Continuing Education, Human Resources' Jean Blake, and Alumni Association Executive Director Colleen Smith.

A budget of \$20,000, provided from the B.C. Excellence in Management Fund, has been set for the day however we anticipate coming in well under this figure.

VCC Day will start at 8:30 with coffee and rolls and a cross-campus trivia contest. Prizes will be awarded.

Vancouver Mayor, Gordon Campbell will provide the opening remarks for the day, followed by our keynote speaker, Thomas R. Berger. Mr. Berger sat on the B.C. Supreme Court from 1971 to 1983 when he resigned to be free to speak on questions of human rights. He has headed three royal commissions as well as the Alaska Native Review Commission. He currently maintains a private law practice and is professor of law at U.B.C.

A panel discussion will follow Mr. Berger's speech. Lucie McNeill, who is the co-host of CBC's Early Edition, will be moderator. Among our panelists will be: Sylvia Russell, VCC alumna and executive Director of the Vancouver Food Bank, Elaine Bernard, Lecturer in Labour studies at SFU, and Keith Gray from the B.C. Mr. Newman is nationally acclaimed as a former editor and currently columnist for Maclean's magazine. #### KEC COMMITTEE ON SEXUAL HARASSMENT:

"Every study conducted on a campus, either in Canada or the United States, shows that sexual harassment is a problem" (E.S. Soloman. A paper presented at the Alberta Student Services Conference, 1986). For instance, a University of Calgary survey stated that 30% of undergraduates encountered sexually inappropriate behaviour. Many of these behaviours emanated from male students but 27% came from people in authority over these students.

Sexual harassment is difficult to define as "it may range from sexual innuendo made at inappropriate times, perhaps in the guise of humour, to coerced sexual relations" (B.C. Federation of Labour). Although sexual harassment typically involves a female as victim, both males and females can be harassed by members of either sex.

Most colleges in B.C. now have or are in the process of developing a policy regarding sexual harassment on their campuses. Such a policy allows the college to deal with this problem in a consistent and fair manner while safeguarding the legal and human rights of all individuals involved.

V.C.C. has no policy on sexual harassment. Over the past year, a committee at Langara has been examining the issue. It seems clear that any proposed policy should involve the participation of representatives from all campuses. The Langara committee has distributed a questionnaire to faculty to find out the extent of this problem. They are formulating a questionnaire for students.

A committee at KEC on sexual harassment is being set up. The purpose would be education of this issue and to participate in the proposal of a VCC policy. We hope to have representation from faculty, staff, students and administrators.
