Only five others have been awarded this honor in B.C. since 1955. We are very proud of you Yvonne.

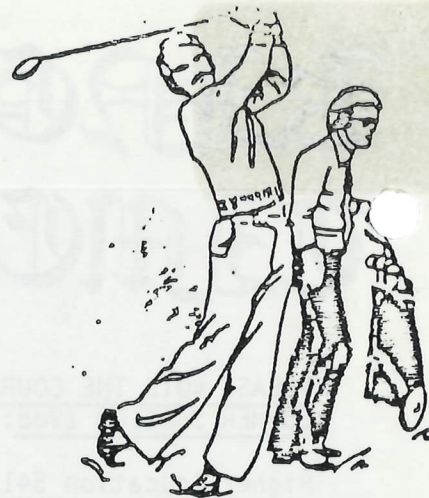

The disability makes absorbing and processing information difficult. To help compensate, her parents recorded her lessons and Tracey listened to the tapes while reading the lessons to herself.

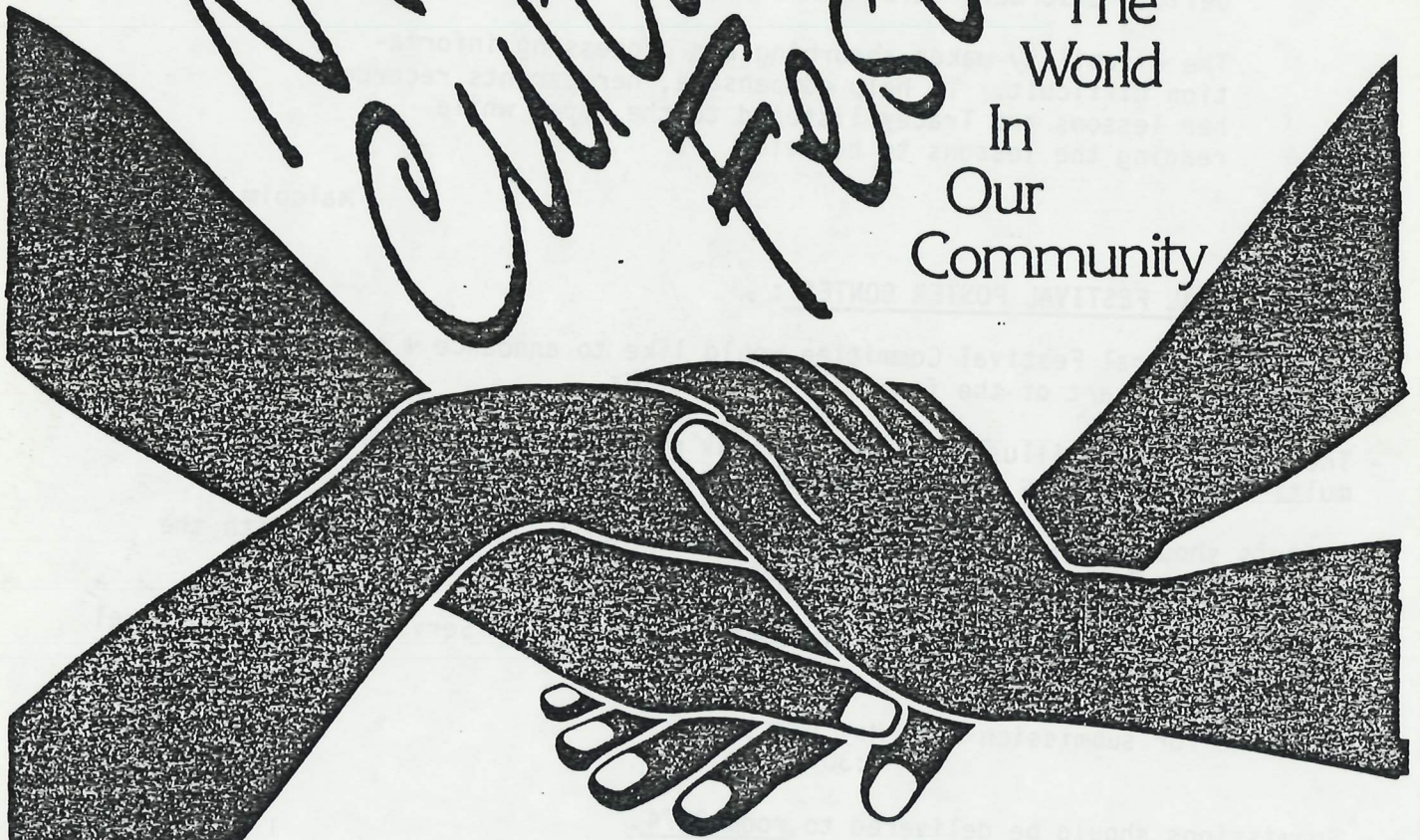

HOW TO GET TO VCC DAY

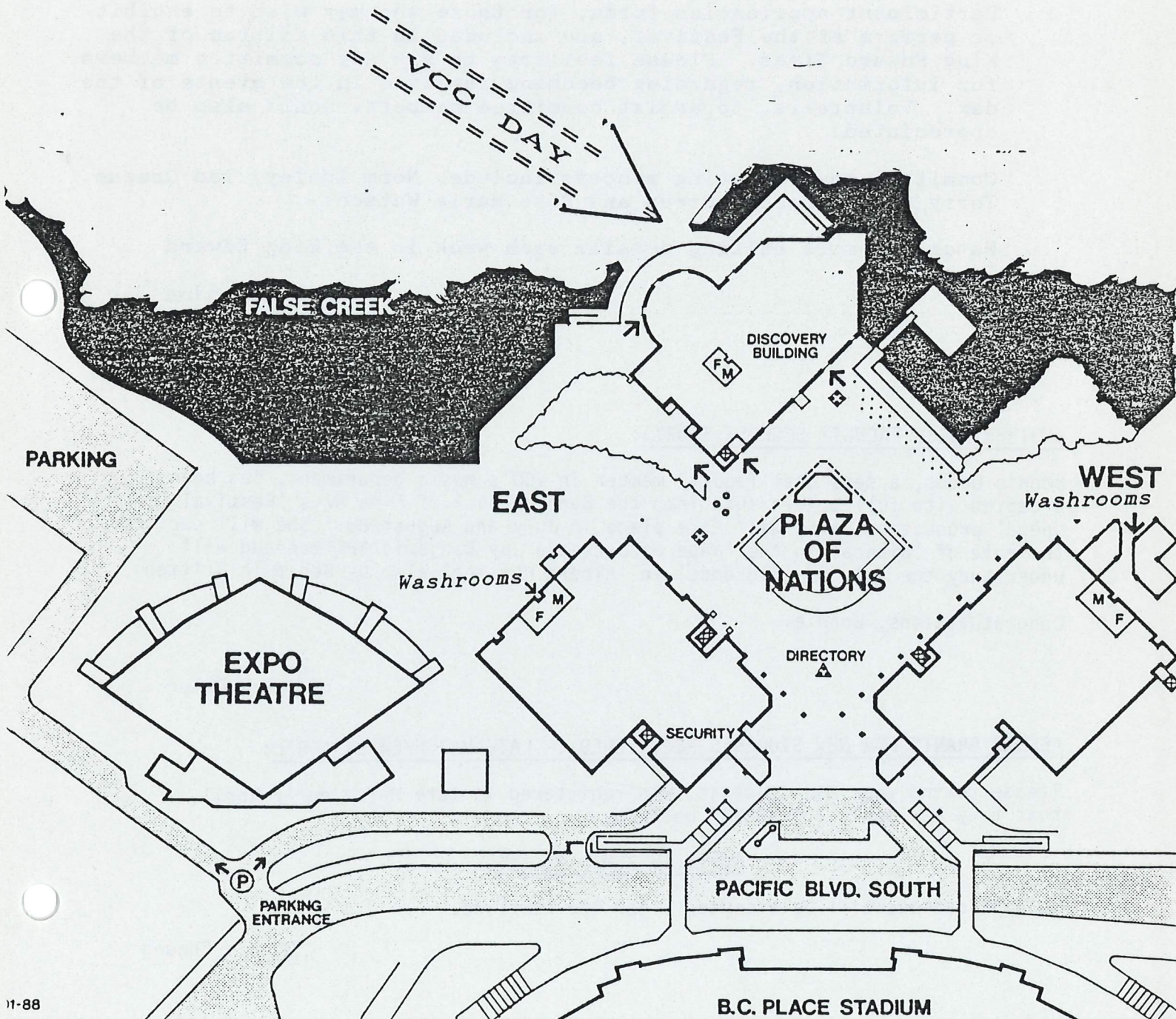
The site for VCC DAY is in the Discovery Building, at the B.C. Enterprise Centre (the former Expo site). The Discovery Building is the large glass building on the north shore of False Creek, directly south of the B.C. Place Stadium.

The access street is Pacific Boulevard South which runs one-way, east-bound, between the Stadium and False Creek. The easiest way to get there, from south of False Creek/English Bay, is via the Cambie Street Bridge, from West End or North Shore, from Cambie Street South.

There is plenty of pay parking, both in the on-site underground lot (about 400 cars) and above ground, east of the Stadium. Parking costs between \$3.00-7.00 for the day. Please note that the College will NOT pay for your parking, so you may want to consider alternatives to driving.

Some suggestions:

1. Skytrain to Stadium Station and walk 10 minutes.
2. Park at VVI (if you normally have a spot there) and walk.
3. Park at KEC (lots of space for all), walk four blocks to Skytrain Broadway Station (at Commercial), then to Stadium Station.
4. Bus down Cambie or Main Street (unfortunately, the buses don't run very close to the site).
5. Car pool and share parking expenses.

Did you know that VCC has a Homestay Program that places visiting international students in Canadian homes? We would like to invite you to participate in the program as a host family. Students desiring Homestay attend classes at KEC, Langara or at one of the high schools in the VSB system and stay with their families for periods of three weeks to eight months. We are presently seeking families interested in hosting students who will be attending our Summer English Language Program in July and August. Students will be Japanese or French Canadian, will stay for three to six weeks, and are keen to experience life with a Vancouver family. Families will be asked to accept two Japanese students or one French Canadian student and will be reimbursed \$16/day per student.
