Spirit Song Theatre Arts Program is proud to present it's student showcase production of 'BURIED CHILD' by Sam Sheperd and directed by David Secunda.

'BURIED CHILD', Sam Shepherd's 1979 Pulitzer Prize winning play, examines the decay of a sacred institution, the American family. In the play, a grandson returns home after an absence of six years. No one recognizes him, or at least they pretend not to recognize him. The situation is funny and macabre at times, but becomes deadly serious when the "family skeletons" are dragged out.

In this production, the actors' experience of the transformation of the Native family structure since European settlement, has helped this all-Native cast gain insight into Sheperd's characters. The actors bring to life the confusion and suffering the the family members, as the once prosperous family of Dodge and Hailey falls apart at the seams.

The role of Hailey is played by Ruby Alexis and understudied by Lynda Kennett. Dodge is portrayed by Sam Bob. Their children, Tilden and Bradley, are played by Aaron Point and Delbert Russ respectively. Dean Bews is Vince and his girlfriend, Shelley, is played by Columpa Bob. Duane Marchand is Father Dewis.

WANTED: RAFT MATES FOR THE CHILKO RIVER EXPEDITION JULY 18th TO JULY 23RD  
A WHITE WATER EXPERIENCE (ONLY THE ADVENTUROUS NEED READ ANY FURTHER):

I invite you to join me on one of North America's premier whitewater river trips. The Chilko and the Chilcotin rivers deliver some of the biggest and most exciting rapids that are run commercially. Besides the excellent whitewater, we will travel through terrain ranging from alpine scenery with snow capped peaks in the background to open grassy plateaus. This is a river trip that has something for everyone.

We begin our trip in Vancouver with a beautiful bushplane flight over the glaciers and snowfields of the Coast Mountains. We set down on the crystal clear waters of Chilko Lake and prepare for our rafting adventure. Our first two days are spent on the exciting Chilko River, climaxing with a thrilling ride through the famous Lava Canyon.

During the latter half of our trip we will travel through the Gang Ranch - North America's second largest ranch - and through a 300,000 acre reserve for Big Horn Sheep. This area also has bear, deer, osprey, spawning salmon and bald eagles in abundance.

As with all of Hyak's trips, they not only ensure our complete safety, but also our total comfort. Our guides will serve up sumptuous meals including beef stroganoff, baked salmon and steak all served with fresh salad, wine and all the trimmings. Every dinner is accompanied with a fresh baked dessert. All of our meals are cooked over the open fire and we carry all of our food and supplies with us; Hyak feel that this extra effort at the campsite makes your wilderness experience more enjoyable.

We end our trip in Vancouver with a magnificent train ride through the Coast Mountains.

#### TRIP INFORMATION

**Trip Start:** We meet early Monday morning (7:30 a.m.) at Hyak's office on Granville Island and catch a float plane out of the inner harbour.

**Trip Finish:** On Day 6, the final day of our trip, we return to Vancouver on a spectacular train ride following the historic Anderson Gold Rush trail.

**Cost:** The price for the six days inclusive of air charters, food, train, wet suit, life jackets, helmets and ground transportation is \$1,095 or \$547.50 if you use your Entertainment 88 coupon.



## CAMPING

Throughout the trip you may choose to participate as fully as you desire, whether that be on the river, loading or unloading the rafts, collecting firewood, or helping in the kitchen. You may also choose to go swimming, photograph, hike, read or relax and leave the work to the guides. We camp on riverside beaches that usually have spectacular views and good areas for hiking before dinner.

Arriving at our evening campsite we unload baggage and equipment from the rafts, and then set up camp. We will arrange toilet facilities at each campsite. Dinner preparations begin in the early evening after the full heat of the day subsides and on hot days it is usually served between 7:00 and 8:00 p.m.

Morning begins with the crackle of the fire and the aroma of breakfast and hot coffee. While the kitchen is being cleaned up after breakfast, trip members pack their bags in preparation for being loaded back onto the rafts.

Food: The food on all of our trips is special. Breakfast and dinner are prepared by the guides over an open fire. Guests awaken to sausages, french toast, bacon, omelettes and the aroma of steaming coffee. Picnic lunches of assorted meats and cheeses, a variety of breads, fruit and cold drinks are served. Dinner may be salmon, steak or a stroganoff served with a fresh salad, vegetables and a selection of wines. Dessert is often a cake hot from the Dutch Oven served with fresh fruit and whipping cream.

Alcohol: A good selection of wine is available with all meals. If you want to bring your own supply of alcohol please bring a moderate amount only and bring it in plastic containers only.

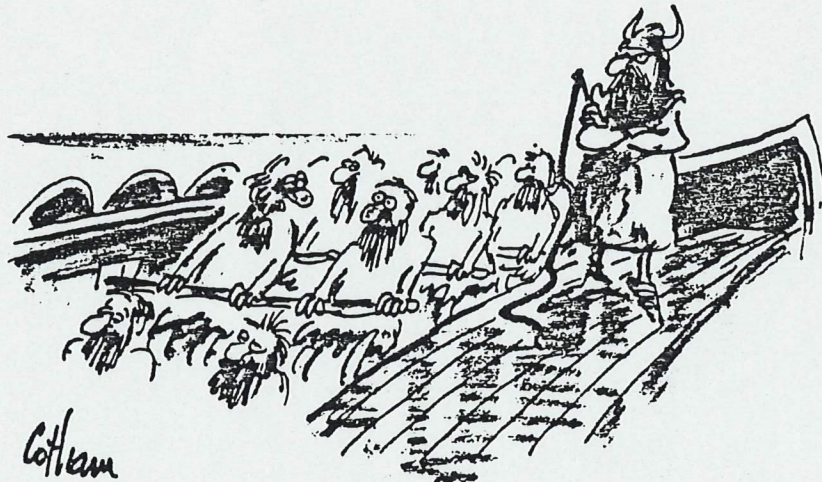
