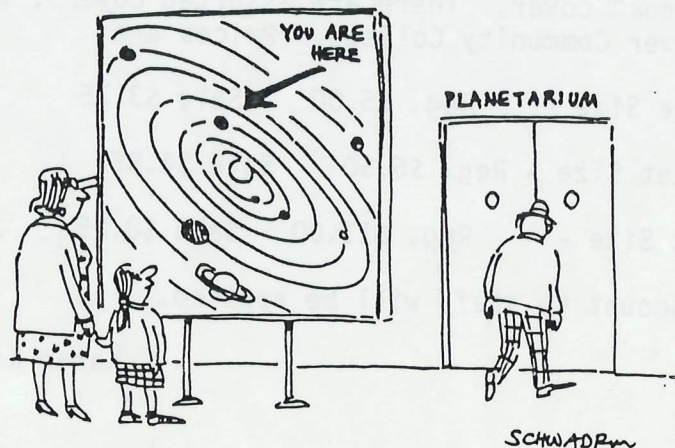
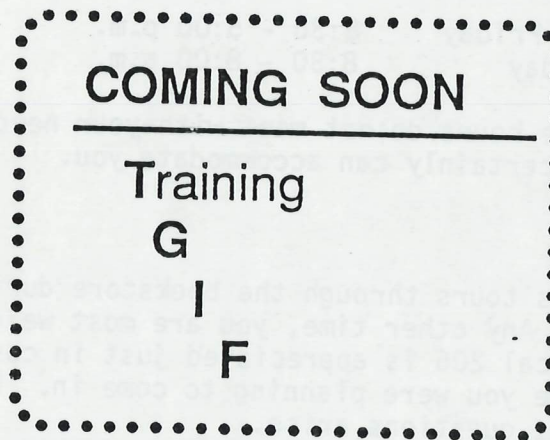

CSED 400 — COMPUTERS IN EDUCATION (1.5 UNITS)
Current research and practice concerning uses of computers in education, including computer assisted instruction and computer-augmented instruction. Students require access to a computer and a printer.

ECED 438 — OBSERVATION AND RECORDING (1.5 UNITS)
Methods of observing and recording children's behaviour in early childhood settings.

CNPS 426 — THE ROLE OF THE TEACHER IN GUIDANCE (3.0 UNITS)
This course is designed to assist the teacher in understanding and using guidance techniques for day-to-day use in the classroom. The emphasis will be on techniques for working with people towards better self understanding and better perspectives of alternatives. The course is based on Adlerian Theory and there is extensive group work involved.
