ACCC FEASIBILITY STUDIES IN INDIA AND SRI LANKA

Dr. Patricia Groves will be part of a four member mission to India and Sri Lanka to explore possibilities for involvement of Canada's colleges and institutes in developmental projects in the India Sub-continent. Along with Dr. John Tibbets, President, Conestoga College in Ontario, Mr. William Day, President, Douglas College, and Mr. Tom Norton, Executive Director, Association of Canadian Community Colleges, Dr. Groves will first meet with ADA and Canada's High Commission Staff in New Delhi, and then travel to Tamil Nadu State to investigate opportunities for an involvement with counterpart institutions. The mission will then split in two to work on the specific project opportunities in Sri Lanka and India. Because of this project, Dr. Groves will be absent from the Campus from late September to mid October.




