
THANKSGIVING HOSTS NEEDED!!



In 1986, we completed our Institutional Self-Study. It resulted in recommendations designed to improve the College. I want to take stock of our progress in addressing the major recommendations.


Towards the end of October, I will send to each of you an opinion survey. I will want to know what changes have occurred in various aspects of your work which relate to the Self-Study findings.
