



K.E.C. FACULTY/STAFF QUESTIONNAIRE ON HARASSMENT

What is harassment?

Harassment is a form of discrimination and is against the law. It means being subjected to unwelcome verbal or physical conduct on the basis of race, sex (including sexual orientation), colour, religion, political belief, national or ethnic origin, disability (physical, mental, learning), age, marital status, family status or conviction of a criminal offence (refer to the Canadian Human Rights Act). It is objectionable behaviour made by a person who knows or who ought reasonably to know that the behaviour would create an environment unconducive to work or study.

Harassment may occur during one incident or over a series of incidents any one of which, in isolation, would not necessarily constitute harassment.

Sexual harassment is a specific type of harassment which places objectionable emphasis on the sex of the individual. Most cases involve men harassing women; however, harassment can occur between individuals of the same sex or women harassing men.

Examples of harassment (including sexual harassment) include:

- unwelcome remarks, jokes, innuendos about a person's body, attire, age, marital status, ethnic or national origin, religion;
- displaying of pornographic, racist or other offensive or derogatory pictures;
- verbal abuse or threats.

IS HARASSMENT A PROBLEM AT V.C.C.?

The purpose of our questionnaire is to examine whether harassment is a problem at K.E.C.

WHY DO WE NEED A POLICY ON HARASSMENT AT V.C.C.?

Studies indicate that harassment occurs on Canadian and American campuses.

A policy on harassment at K.E.C. would be a form of protection for campus personnel and students who feel harassed or who are accused of harassment. There would be clear procedures for the complainant to follow (presently there are no set procedures). The accused would be able to present his/her position in confidentiality. There would be the opportunity for mediation and, therefore, less need for a case to go through a more costly procedure such as a hearing at the B.C. Human Rights Commission. According to the Canadian Human Rights Act, the employer is liable for any act of harassment committed by an employee.

Please take the time to fill our questionnaire so that your harassment committee can begin the task of determining what policies or procedures may be necessary to protect YOU.
