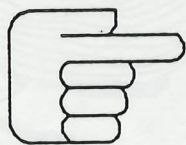
G.E.D. TESTS - OCTOBER 21 AND 22

CHANGE IN MILEAGE ALLOWANCE

Please note the change in mileage allowance as described in the following note from Mr. Jim Ho:

"The mileage allowance paid to V.C.C. employees who use their cars on College business has been established at twenty cents per kilometre for sometime now. Under the authority of the College Board, through its Personnel and Staff Services Committee, the following rates are approved effective on the date indicated:

September 1, 1988 - twenty-six cents per kilometre

April 1, 1989 - thirty cents per kilometre

Although these rates were determined in concert with V.M.R.E.U negotiations, they are applicable to all employees of V.C.C."

The new KEC Student Advisory Committee representing KEC students is comprised of Chris Felske, BTSD; Graham Meek, CF; Namorsh Reddy, CF; Diane Merasty, Student Advocates; Akos Sandor, CF; Samantha Smoley, CF; and Abad Carillo, ESL. SAC has recently endorsed a grant of \$12,000 to be matched by the VCC Educational Foundation for SAC Scholarships to KEC students; a \$1,000 grant to the KEC United Way campaign for 1988; and continues to supply 45% of all fees collected for student contribution of \$10,000 for emergency loans and some 83 bursaries ranging from \$50 to \$250 were matched by the provincial ministry for a total fund of \$20,000.
