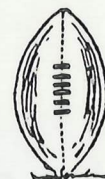
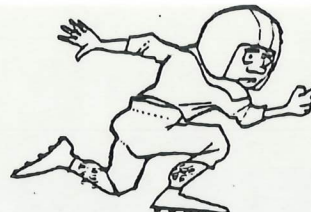

LESLEY COLLEGE M. ED IN CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION WITH AN EMPHASIS ON CREATIVE ARTS IN LEARNING

Lesley College of Cambridge Mass entered into an agreement with V.C.C. several months ago to offer an M.Ed programme at KEC on an outreach basis. The programme is now about to get underway. The first course, "Integrating the Arts into the Curriculum" will be offered the weekends of November 11-13 and December 9-11 by Lesley College, faculty member Mark Rittenberg. Nineteen students from Vancouver, Victoria and Seattle are presently enrolled in the Lesley College Graduate School for this M. Ed Degree. There is space for 5 more. The Degree takes 2 years to complete, costs U.S. \$4785.00, and involves students in one intensive weekend per month (on average).
