





FIRST CITIZENS' FUND STUDENT BURSARY PROGRAM

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

Incentive Bursaries are available to British Columbia born status, non-status and Metis Indians who are attending post-secondary provincial institutions on a full-time basis. Non-funded Native Indian Students who rely on Canada Student Loans can qualify for a bursary of up to \$2,000 per academic year. Funded students are eligible for a busary up to a maximum of \$700 per academic year.

QUALIFYING GUIDELINES:

- a) Applicants must have been born in and currently reside within the Province of British Columbia. They must attend a British Columbia university or college on a full-time basis, or be registered in a minimum of three full credit courses.
- b) Students must be enrolled in a minimum two-year academic program.
- c) Applicants must attain a satisfactory scholastic standing, the equivalent of C+ or better.
- d) Validated registration at a British Columbia post-secondary institution must be included with the application.
- e) Student applicants must be recommended by a Band Council or bona fide Native Organization.
- f) Bursaries will be paid after receipt of marks for the academic year designated on the application.
- g) Students living at home while attending college or university and who are financially dependent upon their parents, guardian or sponsor are ineligible.

Applications are available at the Financial Aid Office & the Counselling Career Centre.
