

#### BULLETIN FROM UBC

Instructors who use the UBC mail system and \*forum conferencing system will be interested in the following:

# "Educators free use of UBC BCCEC Accounts to end April 1, 1989

Effective April 1, 1989 educators in B.C. who have been using the free BCCEC accounts will have to pay real money in order to keep those accounts. The cost of the accounts for the period from April 1, 1989 till April 1, 1990 will be subsidized. The cost of the accounts will be the same or less than the amount of money that shows up for the usage of your current account (we are currently revising our rate structure and the new rates will be the same or less than the current rates, but at this time the new rates have not been established). Effective April 1, 1990 the cost will rise to our normal outside Educational commercial rate.

To estimate what the cost of your account would be as a commercial customer just note what your current usage is. This can be done by giving the command:

#### **\$ACCOUNT FULL**

The same amount of usage at your new commercial rate will be the same or less than the amount shown...."

VCC instructors who would like to continue to use this system should send their name, campus local and UBC ID to Jim Goard at the VCC Computing Centre, Langara. The Computing Centre will pay for the first \$50. of use per user for accounts limited to electronic mail and conferencing. Since April 1, 1988, I have used only \$16.

#### STUDENT'S RALLY/DEMONSTRATION

The Student Advisory Committee is encouraging King Edward students to attend the Post-Secondary Student's Rally/Demonstration scheduled for March 9, 1989 at 1:30 P.M. The rally will be held at Robson Square. The S.A.C. has arranged for free transportation for students to Robson Square, and back to the Campus, in order to minimize loss of class time.

The following three demands would form the theme of the rally:

- 1. That the following new post-secondary student "seats" be created:
  - . 1,500 by Sept. 1989
  - . 5,000 by Sept. 1990
  - . 10,000 by Sept. 1991
- 2. That a "freeze" be placed on tuition fees at all public post-secondary institutions in B.C.
- 3. That a "catch-up" budget increase of 11% for post-secondary education be included in the next provincial budget.

The Student Advisory Committee would appreciate any support from staff and faculty in encouraging students to attend. We are concerned that E.S.L. students may not be able to miss class time, yet they seem to suffer the most by lack of funding. Some suggestions from S.A.C. on how you can help:

- 1. Make class announcements of time and date of rally.
- 2. Use out-of-class time as a field trip, perhaps with follow-up, essay, paragraph, etc.
  - 3. For staff and faculty to attend the rally if possible.
- 4. To send messages or telegrams to be read at the rally. These can be dropped off at Grant Kelly's office in the Learning Centre.

Government funding is a concern of faculty and students! We would appreciate any support you can give us.
