ASSERTIVENESS WORKSHOPS FOR STUDENTS


These Workshops will cover:

'Computer-Based Learning in the Humanities' or "Why depend on a MOUSE When a teacher can do better?"

This was the theme of a workshop presented at the Professional Development Day (April 25, 1989) of the Langara Faculty Association.

The presenters, Walter Behnke and Marie Burlinson, used this opportunity to demonstrate CBE software developed by their project team at VCC - King Edward Campus. The CBE course being developed is called: 'The Workings of Markets'. The content area of this computer-based course is the traditional Introductory Economics of Sr. High, College, First Year. With a high level of interaction (involving graphing, completing tables of figures, text entry, different objective question types, and short paragraph responses) students gain competency in the application of basic economic concepts introduced under the usual topics favored by economists: scarcity, opportunity cost, production possibility curves, specialization and trade, demand and supply.

Built into the visually pleasing and graphically illustrated program are several on-line, function-key branching functions to give learners constant access to overall program control, glossary of terms, and a note editor. Comments or short paragraph answers can be appended to a course administrator file. Comprehensive testing and course administration functions are also built into the software.

Message left by a workshop participant: "This is a cool program."

The Langara workshop provided a good mix of hands-on demonstration and exploration of CBE issues. Participants discussed issues of integration of CBE into existing traditional class settings, pros and cons of various aspects of CBE, funding and development of CBE software.

Development of 'The Working of Markets' continues at VCC-KEC and should be completed at the end of August 1989. information and demo disks will be made available later. the meantime, direct inquiries to:


A REMINDER FROM THE CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

How much are the bursaries? What are they for?

The value of each bursary ranges from \$30 to \$250, depending on the availability of funds and number of applicants. Students may use their bursary money to meet their unmet financial need, e.g. to pay for their books or busfare.

Who can apply?

Part-time and full-time KEC students who:

- (1) can demonstrate financial need after they have exhausted all other avenues of financial assistance; and
- (2) are attending classes regularly and progressing satisfactorily in their courses of study.

When and how can I apply?

Bursary applications are available at both the Financial Aid Office and the Counselling Career Centre in January, May and September. Completed applications should be returned to the Financial Aid Office. The deadline is THE LAST DAY OF JANUARY, MAY AND SEPTEMBER.
The results will be given out one month after the deadline.
