

DEFINITION


Carousel Theatre, a member of the Professional Association of Canadian Theatres, is a non-profit professional producing organization based in Vancouver. It is dedicated to relating the arts to individual and social awareness, building new audiences for classical and contemporary theatre, and educating audiences through performances and workshops. Although particular emphasis is placed on presenting the plays of William Shakespeare and other classical works, Carousel Theatre's productions also include contemporary playwrights who explore current concerns.

PURPOSE

- To build an informed new audience from the public, private, and university student population, as well as offering productions of classical and contemporary plays for a broad-based adult audience.
- To provide for broad-based student and adult audiences, economically accessible theatrical and educational programs of the highest calibre.
- To challenge students' minds and to guide them towards the satisfaction of discovering not only the structure of a play but also its connection to their own lives.
- To offer in-school workshops for students and teachers led by professional artists to enhance the theatrical experience, adding dramatically to the educational value of the performance.

IMMEDIATE GOALS

- To bring Vancouver Theatre and the lower mainland student community together for mutual enrichment and inspiration integrating theatre-going into Vancouver's public and private school, college and university systems. There are over a quarter of a million students in the lower mainland area and yet there is little organized effort to connect these students to the Vancouver Theatre community. The extraordinary artistic, social and curriculum resources of the theatre are untapped and the future audience would, without programs like Carousel Theatre's, remain undeveloped.
- To tour throughout communities in Western Canada, bringing exciting, relevant productions to general audiences, schools, and colleges.



THE CAROUSEL THEATRE AUDIENCE

• In reaching youth audiences, Carousel Theatre performs for a large portion of minority students, many of whom have never been to the theatre. Carousel Theatre's economically feasible and educational productions are mounted by top level directors, actors, designers, and musicians. While a substantial portion of the Carousel Theatre audience is under the age of 22, all of its productions are open to the general public and address issues and needs of our society at large.

BACKGROUND

- Founded in 1974 by Artistic Director, Elizabeth Ball, the recipient of major cultural awards in Canada
 and the United States, Carousel Theatre, resident in the Waterfront Theatre on Granville Island, has
 performed at the National Arts Centre, UNESCO in Paris, and the Vancouver International Festival, and
 has toured nationally and internationally to elementary, junior high, high schools, and universities as well
 as many public venues.
- Carousel Theatre has featured some of Canada's finest theatre artists including distinguished actors Colin
 Miller and Barney O'Sullivan. Productions have been shaped by such innovative directors as Susan Ferley
 (Alberta Theatre Projects, Globe Theatre, Stratford), Roy Surette (Artistic Director, Touchstone Theatre), and
 Allen MacInnis (Associate Artistic Director, Alberta Theatre Projects). Carousel Theatre has also featured
 Shakespeare workshops with the renowned Hungarian director, Laszlo Marton, Artistic Director of the
 Vigszinhaz Theatre in Budapest.
- Carousel Theatre employs over 150 actors, directors, and other theatre artists annually.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Resident at the Waterfront Theatre on Granville Island, Carousel Theatre performs each year to over 100,000 audience members in the theatre and on tour.
- Each year Carousel Theatre performs in more than 60 communities in the provinces of British Columbia and Alberta, travelling more than 20,000 kilometers in three months.
- Carousel Theatre School, Vancouver's oldest and largest theatre school, provides exciting classes year-round for all ages at all levels of experience.
- For the past eight years, Carousel Theatre and the New Play Centre have developed young playwrights through The Young Playwrights Search competition. Winning scripts by high school students are now published and have been produced at the International Festival of Young Playwrights in Sydney, Australia and on CBC-TV.
- Carousel Theatre's programs of regular signed performances for the hearing impaired are still unique in Canada.
